EXCEL STILL MORE

August 20, 2023 Acts 17:1-10

Main Idea

After a time of blessed ministry followed by brutal persecution at Philippi, the missionary team of Paul, Silas and Timothy arrived in the city of Thessalonica. A large port city with a sizeable Jewish community, the missionaries preached Christ in the local synagogue over the course of three Sabbaths. The Lord blessed their ministry with many converts, including some Jews and a large number of God-fearing Greeks. Jealousy among the Jewish leaders, however, once again produced fierce persecution and the missionaries were forced to leave the fledgling church sooner than they wanted to. The gospel however, had taken hold. Lives were transformed and in spite of the challenges that confronted it, the Thessalonian church thrived and remains an example for churches even today.
