Main Idea:

"Revival" can be defined as spiritual awakening from a period of dormancy or decline in the life of an individual believer, or when widespread, in the life of the believing community. Although the word "revival" is not an expressly biblical term, it well describes a number of spiritual awakenings documented in Scripture that God's people experienced as a result of His leading and grace. One such revival was experienced by the faithful remnant who returned to the land and rebuilt the temple and the city of Jerusalem. God worked mightily through their rededication to know and live out the implications of His Word.
