April 21, 2024 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24 Sanctification

Main Idea:

Beyond their justification, it is God's will that disciples of Jesus be increasingly transformed into His likeness. Throughout the New Testament, and including 1 Thessalonians, this process is often called sanctification. Although our sanctification as believers is God's work, and He Himself will ultimately sanctify us through and through, here and now we are called to strive to grow in holiness through obeying the Word in the Spirit's power.

Outline:

1) As believers, although required by our Lord to strive to grow in personal holiness, we are also dependent on Him to accomplish it for us.

4 ways we're to fuel and hasten our sanctification here and now:

- By cooperating with the Holy Spirit
- By loving, studying, and obeying God's Word
- By devoting ourselves to prayer
- By spending as much time as possible in harmonious community with the people of God
- 2) As believers we can rest assured that God Himself will complete our sanctification through and through in due course.
