Grateful Praise for a Faithful Church
2 Thessalonians 1:1-4

Main Idea:

After Paul, Silas and Timothy were forced to leave Thessalonica the enemies of the gospel directed all their rage at the fledgling church. Its people however, remained strong in the Lord and earned a stellar reputation for their faithfulness (1 Thessalonians 1:6-10). But the persecution didn't subside, and the enemy intensified the attack by assailing the church with false teachers and even a counterfeit letter said to be from the missionaries and falsely stating that the Day of the Lord had come.

Because this dangerous turn of events created confusion in the minds of some of the believers, threatening to jeopardize their spiritual well-being and testimony, Paul wrote his second inspired epistle to the church to correct the confusion with the truth. Before doing so however, he praised the Thessalonian believers for their growth in the faith, in love and in perseverance in the face of such fierce opposition. From their fidelity in these areas, four hallmarks of an excellent church come to light.

- 1) An excellent church is composed of real and committed believers in Jesus

Questions for further contemplation and application after the message:

#2	In the message, Pastor Vaughn said that a church that abandons the biblical gospel ceases to be a church at all. Do you agree? Why or why not?
#3	What key commitments must a church make to help its people continually grow in spiritual maturity?
#4	How would you describe "agape" love? How is it demonstrated by believers within the local church?
#5	Is perseverance a good gauge of spiritual maturity? Why? What produces perseverance in the believer's life? (James 1:2-3) What is the blessed result of perseverance? (James 1:4)
