November 16, 2025 2 Samuel 7 The Davidic Covenant

Main idea:

After successfully moving the ark of the covenant to Jerusalem, David desired to build a temple to house it in. He himself was living in a beautiful palace, and it seemed only fitting. Nathan the prophet approved of David's plan and initially encouraged him to proceed. But David's desire was not Yahweh's plan, and He sent Nathan back to the king with word that he was not to build a temple. However, Nathan also brought David a breathtaking promise from Yahweh: that He would establish the kingdom of a future descendant of David's forever!

How certain can one be that Jesus is the ultimate fulfillment of the promise God made to David? #5 According to 2 Samuell 7:24, what is the duration of God's promises to Israel?
