



Questions for further contemplation and application after the message:

#1 What does Paul mean when he writes that "the gospel is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes" in Romans 1:16?

#2 Compare the "infants" in 11:25 to the "poor in spirit" described in 5:3, the "children" in 18:3-4 and the apostle Paul in Philippians 3:8. What essential qualities can you draw from these passages that are descriptive of a true Christian?

Read 1 Corinthians 1:18-25. How does this part of Paul's message to the church at Corinth contribute to a better understanding of today's text?

Can you think of some other Scripture passages that expose the deadly danger of self-righteousness and spiritual pride?

#3 Other than Jesus, who has real and intimate knowledge of the Father, and how have they received it?

#4 Why do you think Jesus describes the reward of salvation as "rest"?
