- #2 How did the chief priests and Pharisees show their hypocrisy in their meeting with Pilate in 27:62-64?
- In spite of overwhelming evidence that Jesus is the Christ and Son of God, the religious leaders of the Jews refused to believe in Him. Why?
- #4 How did the chief priests and Pharisee inadvertently authenticate the reality of Jesus' resurrection by talking Pilate into having the tomb sealed and guarded by Roman soldiers?
- #5 Do you think that the courageous loyalty and faithfulness of Mary Magdalene led in part to their blessing in being first to see Jesus after His resurrection?
- #6 After listening to today's message, how would you describe the angel's missions in 28:1-7?
- #7 How does Matthew's description of the worship of the women proved that Jesus' risen body was a real body and not merely a spiritual apparition?
- #8 What does the resurrection of Jesus assure for His believers?
