

FAITH WITHOUT SEEING | Kev Ntseeg Yam Uas Tsis Pom
John | Yauhas 4:43–54

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Jesus returned to **CANA** in Galilee, the place where He had previously turned **WATER** into wine. A **ROYAL** official came to Jesus because his son was very **SICK** and close to death. The official's son was in **CAPERNAUM**, while Jesus was in Cana. The man may have had position, influence, and resources, but there was one thing he could not do:

- He could not **HEAL** his son.
 - So when he heard about Jesus, he went to find Him.
 - Sometimes our greatest problems remind us how much we **NEED** Jesus.
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1. COME TO JESUS | Los Cuag Yexus. vv. 46–47

The royal official heard that **JESUS** had returned to Galilee. His son was close to **DEATH**. So the father went to Jesus and **BEGGED** Him to come and heal his son. The father's crisis brought him to Jesus.

Faith Begins by Coming | Kev ntseeg pib thaum mus cuag Yexus

- The father could not solve his problem himself.
- He recognized: “**I need JESUS.**”
- Faith does not mean we never have problems.
- Faith means we know **WHO** to bring our problems to.

Faith brings my NEED to Jesus. |

Kev ntseeg coj qhov kuv xav tau mus rau Yexus

- When I am afraid, I can come to **JESUS**.
- When I am hurting, I can come to **JESUS**.
- When I don't know what to do, I can come to **JESUS**.
- When my situation is beyond my control, I can still come to **JESUS**.

Remember: COME TO JESUS | Los Cuag Yexus

- Bring your **NEED** to Jesus.

2. TRUST JESUS' WORD | Ciasiab Rau Yexus Cov Lus. vv 48–50

The father wanted Jesus to **COME** with him to Capernaum.

He told Jesus: “Sir, come down before my child **DIES.**”

But Jesus did not go with him.

Instead, Jesus said: “Go...your son will **LIVE.**”

- The father could not see his son.
- He could not see whether the fever was gone.
- He had no visible **PROOF** that anything had changed.
- All he had was the **WORD** of **JESUS**.

The Turning Point

- John 4:50 says: “The man took Jesus at his **WORD** and departed.”
- The father believed Jesus before he **SAW** the miracle.
- He had to decide: “**Is Jesus' WORD enough for me?**”

Faith Trusts Before It Sees | Kev Ntseeg Tso Siab Ua Ntej Pom

We often want:

- **SEE** → then **BELIEVE**

But biblical faith teaches us:

- **HEAR GOD'S WORD** → **BELIEVE** → **WALK**
- Faith is not believing that God will always do exactly what **WE** want.
- Faith is trusting that **JESUS** is trustworthy even when we do not understand what He is doing.

Faith trusts Jesus' WORD before seeing Jesus' WORK. |

Kev ntseeg tso siab rau Yexus **COV LUS** ua ntej pom Yexus **TES HAUJLWM**.

- I may not understand God's **TIMING**.
- I may not see the **ANSWER** yet.
- God may not answer the way I **EXPECTED**.
- But I can still trust **JESUS**.

Remember: TRUST JESUS' WORD | Ciasiab Rau Yexus Cov Lus

- Take Jesus at His **WORD**.

3. WALK BY FAITH | *Taug Kev Ntawm Txoj Kev Ntseeg. vv 51–53*

After Jesus told the father that his son would live, the father **DEPARTED**.

- He began his journey back **HOME**.
- He still could not see his son.
- He had not received confirmation.

But Jesus had **SPOKEN**. So the father began to **WALK**.

Faith Takes Action | *Kev Ntseeg Yuav Tsum Ua Haujlwm*

- The father did not simply say: “**I believe.**”
- His actions demonstrated his faith.
- He **BELIEVED** Jesus and started walking home.
- Walking by faith means trusting **JESUS** enough to take the next step of **OBEDIENCE**.

While He Was Walking...

The father's servants came to meet him.

They told him: “Your son is **LIVING**.”

- The father asked when his son became better.
- The servants told him when the **FEVER** had left.
- Then the father realized something amazing.

His son was healed at the exact **TIME** Jesus said:

“Your son will live.”

While the father was **WALKING**... Jesus was already **WORKING**.

- The father could not see what Jesus was doing.
- But Jesus was still working.

Walking by faith means taking the next step of OBEDIENCE even when I cannot see the OUTCOME.

2 Corinthians 5:7 says: “For we walk by **FAITH**, not by **SIGHT**.”

“Rauqhov peb ua neej rawsli kev ntseeg, tsis yog rawsli qhovmuag pom.”

- Faith does not require me to know everything that will **HAPPEN**.
- Faith requires me to trust the One who **KNOWS**.

Remember: WALK BY FAITH | *Taug Kev Ntawm Txoj Kev Ntseeg*

- **Take the next step of OBEDIENCE.**

THE FATHER'S JOURNEY OF FAITH |

Txojkev Taug Ntawm Leej Txiv Txojkev Ntseeg

1. First, he **CAME**.

He heard about **JESUS** and came looking for Him.

2. Second, he **TRUSTED**.

He took Jesus at His **WORD** even though he had not seen the answer.

3. Third, he **WALKED**.

He acted on what Jesus had **SAID**.

Then he discovered that while he was walking, Jesus had already been **WORKING**.

FROM SEEING TO BELIEVING | *Ntawm Kev Pom Mus Rau Kev Ntseg*

At the beginning of the story, the father wanted **JESUS** to come with him so he could **SEE** Jesus heal his son.

But **JESUS** taught him to trust His **WORD** without seeing.

At the end of the story, the father discovered that **JESUS**' word had authority even from a **DISTANCE**.

John 4:53 tells us: “So he and his whole household **BELIEVED**.”

- The miracle did more than heal a sick boy.
- The miracle pointed the family to **JESUS**.
- The greatest gift in this story was not the son's healing.
- The greatest gift was that the family came to **BELIEVE** in Jesus.

WHAT DOES THIS TEACH ME ABOUT **JESUS** ?

- **JESUS** has authority. | *Yexus muaj txujchim.*
Jesus did not have to physically **TOUCH** the boy. He spoke.
- **JESUS** can be trusted. | *Yexus yog tus ntseeg tau.*
What Jesus said came **TRUE**.
- **JESUS** is not limited by distance. | *Kev deb txwv tsis tau Yexus*
Jesus was in Cana while the boy was in **CAPERNAUM**.
- **JESUS** wants more than miracle-seekers. |
Yexus xav tau cov Ntseeg dua cov nrhiav tej txujci xwb.
His signs point us toward **FAITH** in Him.
