

Lesson 12: Living Water | Dej Cawv Txojxiab — John | Yauhas 4:1–15

Big Idea:

Jesus meets us in the places of our deepest thirst and offers what the world cannot give—living **water** that satisfies the soul and leads to eternal **life**.

Yexus Thiab Tus Pojnim Xamalis

1–Cov Falixais hnov tias Yexus muaj thwjtim thiab muab neeg ua kevcai rausdej coob dua Yauhas. (2–Qhov tseeb tiag, Yexus yeej tsis tau muab leejtwg ua kevcai rausdej, tsuas yog Nws cov thwjtim muab xwb.) 3–Thaum Yexus hnov li ntawd, Nws txawm tawm hauv xeev Yudas thiab rovqab mus rau pem xeev Kalilais; 4–Txojkev uas Nws yuav taug yuavtsum tau hla lub xeev Xamalis mus.

5–Yexus mus txog ntawm ib lub nroog hauv xeev Xamalis uas hu ua Xikhas, lub nroog ntawd nyob ze ntawm thaj av uas Yakhaug muab rau nws tus tub Yauxej. 6–Yakhaug lub qhovdej kuj nyob rau ntawd, thaum Yexus taug kev los Nws lim heev, Nws thiaj zaum ntawm lub qhovdej ntawd. Lub sijhawm ntawd yog thaum tavs.

7–Muaj ib tug pojnim Xamalis tuaj nqa dej, Yexus hais rau tus pojnim ntawd tias, “Thov koj muab ib qhov dej rau Kuv haus.” (8–Yexus cov thwjtim mus yuav zaub-mov rau tom nroog lawm.)

9–Tus pojnim ntawd teb Yexus hais tias, “Koj yog neeg Yudais, thiab kuv yog neeg Xamalis, uacas Koj lam thov dej ntawm kuv haus?” (Cov *Yudais yeej tsis lam siv tej khob thiab tej tais uas cov Xamalis siv li.*)

10–Yexus teb nws hais tias, “Yog koj paub yam uas Vajtswv pub, thiab paub tus uas tabtom thov dej ntawm koj haus, ces koj yeej yuav thov ntawm Nws, thiab Nws yuav muab cov dej uas muaj txojxiab rau koj haus.”

11–Tus pojnim ntawd hais tias, “Koj twb tsis muaj lub thoob ntaus dej, thiab lub qhovdej no tob heev. Koj yuav muab cov dej uas muaj txojxiab qhovtwg los? 12–Peb yawgkoob Yakhaug yog tus uas muab lub qhovdej no rau peb; nws thiab nws cov tub thiab nws tej tsiaj puavleej haus dej hauv lub qhovdej no. Koj tseem loj dua peb yawgkoob Yakhaug thiab lov?”

13–Yexus teb tias, “Txhua tus uas haus cov dej no tseem yuav rov nqhis dua, 14–tiamsis tus uas haus cov dej uas Kuv yuav muab rau nws, nws yuav tsis rov nqhis dua ib zaug li lawm. Cov dej uas Kuv muab rau nws yuav dhau mus ua cov dej cawmsiav txhawv hauv nws lub siab thiab muab tau txojxiab mus ibtxhis rau nws.”

15–Tus pojnim hais rau Yexus hais tias, “Thov Koj muab cov dej uas Koj hais ko rau kuv! Xwv kuv thiaj yuav tsis rov nqhis ib zaug ntxiv li lawm thiab thiaj tsis tau rov tuaj nqa dej hauv lub qhovdej no.”

Point 1: Jesus Goes Where Others Will Not Go

Yexus mus qhov chaw uas lwmtus tsis kam mus

John 4:1–4

1. **Jesus** “had to pass through” Samaria.
2. There was deep hostility between the **Jews** and the Samaritans.

Key Truth: **Jesus** goes where grace is needed.

3. The gospel calls us to cross barriers and show the **love** of Christ to others.

Point 2: Jesus Meets Us at Our Thirst

Yexus ntsib peb ntawm qhov chaw uas peb muaj kev nqhis

John 4:5–9

4. **Jesus** met the Samaritan woman at Jacob’s well.
5. **Jesus** was tired from His journey, showing us His genuine humanity.
6. The woman came looking for physical water, but **Jesus** recognized her deeper spiritual thirst.
7. We often thirst for **love**, acceptance, peace, security, purpose, and hope.

Key Truth: Our thirst does not drive **Jesus** away; it is often where He meets us.

Point 3: Jesus Offers What the World Cannot Give

Tswv Yexus muab yam uas ntiajteb muab tsis tau

John 4:10–12

8. Jesus told the woman that He could give her “**living** water.”
9. Jesus called living water the “**gift** of God.”
10. Salvation cannot be earned; it is given to us through **Christ**.
11. Jacob provided physical water, but **Jesus** offers eternal life.

Key Truth: Jesus does not merely improve our lives; He gives us **Jesus** life.

Point 4: Earthly Wells Leave Us Thirsty Again

Cov qhov dej ntiajteb ua rau peb nqhis dej dua

John 4:13

12. **Jesus** said, “Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again.”
13. Modern “**wells**” can include money, career, relationships, approval, entertainment, and achievement.
14. Good things become dangerous when we expect them to do what only **God** can do.

Key Truth: Temporary things cannot satisfy an **eternal** soul.

15. Our deepest identity, security, and satisfaction must come from **Christ**.

Point 5: Jesus Becomes the Source Within Us

Tswv Yexus yog lub hauv paus hauv peb lub neej

John 4:14–15

16. **Jesus** said the water He gives becomes a spring of water within us.
17. This **spring** wells up to eternal life.
18. In John 7:37–39, living **water** is connected with the Holy Spirit.
19. We can draw daily from **Jesus** through Scripture, prayer, worship, repentance, obedience, and Christian community.

Key Truth: **Jesus** doesn't simply satisfy our thirst—He becomes our source.

Five Truths to Remember

1. **Jesus** goes where others will not go — **Grace crosses barriers**.
 2. **Jesus** meets us at our thirst — **We don't have to hide our emptiness**.
 3. **Jesus** offers what the world cannot give — **Living water is God's gift**.
 4. Earthly wells leave us thirsty again — **Temporary things cannot satisfy eternal needs**.
 5. Jesus becomes the source within us — **Through Christ we receive new and eternal life**.
