

The Lamb of God | Vajtswv tus Menyuum Yaj

Scripture: John 1:29–34 Theme: Jesus' Mission and Sacrifice

John | Yauhas 1:29–34

29-Hnub tomqab, Yauhas pom Yexus taug kev tuaj rau ntawm nws, Yauhas thiaj hais tias, "Nej saib seb, tus ntawd yog **Vajtswv tus menyuum Yaj** uas **yuav ris neeg ntiajteb lub txim!**" 30-Tus no ntag lau, yog tus uas kuv qhia hais tias, 'Muaj ib tug tabtom lawv kuv qab los, **Nws muaj hwjchim loj dua kuv**, rauqhov **Nws yeej ibtxwm muaj nyob uantej** yug kuv lawm. 31-Kuv tsis tau paub tias Nws yuav yog leejtwg, tiamsis kuv los muab neeg ua kevcai raus los ntawm dej kom cov Yixalayeas paub Nws."

32-Yauhas ua timkhawv hais tias, "Kuv pom Vaj Ntsujplig zoo ib yam li tus nquab los saum ntuj los nyob saum Nws. 33-Kuv tseem tsis tau paub tias Nws yog leejtwg, tiamsis Vajtswv tus uas txib kuv los muab neeg ua kevcai rausdej hais rau kuv tias, 'Koj yuav pom Vaj Ntsujplig los thiab tsaws rau saum ib tug txivneej; **Nws yog tus uas yuav muab neeg ua kevcai raus hauv Vaj Ntsujplig tus Dawbhuv.**" 34-Yauhas hais tias, "Kuv twb pom Nws lawm, thiab kuv qhia rau nej hais tias, **Nws yog Vajtswv tus Tub.**"

1. Jesus Is the Lamb of God | Yexus Yog Vajtswv tus Menyuum Yaj

John 1:29- "Behold, **the Lamb of God**, who takes away the sin of the world!" "Nej saib seb, tus ntawd yog Vajtswv tus menyuum **Yaj** uas yuav ris neeg ntiajteb lub txim!"

Important "Lamb of God" connections from the Old Testament:

- **The Passover Lamb (Exodus | Khiav Dim 12)**
The blood of the lamb protected Israel from judgment.
- **Temple Sacrifices (Leviticus | Levi Kevcai)**
Animals were regularly sacrificed to atone for sin.
 - (1) Lev. 1:1-9= **Burnt Offering** (2x **Day** - morning & afternoon),
 - (2) Lev. 4:1-5:13= **Sin Offering** (as needed, specific single sin),
 - (3) Lev. 16:15 = **Day of Atonement** (**1**x a Year)
- **Isaiah's Suffering Servant (Isaiah | Yaxayas 53:7)**
The servant of God would be led like a lamb to slaughter. John reveals that Jesus would become the **ultimate sacrifice for sin**.

2. Jesus Removes Sin | Yexus Rhuav Tshem Kev Txhaum

- Yauhas hais tias Yexus "**yuav ris neeg ntiajteb lub txim.**"

This means:

- Jesus does not simply ignore **sin**.
- **He** carries it and removes it through His sacrifice.
- On the cross, **Jesus** took our guilt so we could receive forgiveness.

2 Corinthians | Kauleethaus 5:21

21-Khetos yeej **tsis muaj** txim, tiamsis vim Vajtswv hluv peb heev, Nws thiaj muab peb lub txim rau Khetos ris, kom nyob rau hauv Khetos, peb thiaj yuav dhau tau mus ua neeg dawbhuv.'

3. Jesus Gives the Holy Spirit | Yexus Muab Vajtswv Ntsujplig

John also testifies that he **saw** the **Spirit descend like a dove** and remain on Jesus.

- This reveals that Jesus is the **Messiah sent by God**.
- John also says **Jesus** will baptize with the Holy Spirit.
- This means **Jesus** does more than forgive sin.
- **He** gives believers **new life and spiritual power**.

1-What does it mean that Jesus takes away sin rather than simply covering it?

In the Old Testament sacrificial system, sacrifices temporarily **covered sin**. But Jesus' sacrifice **removes sin** permanently. **Hebrews 10:12**

2-Why is the presence of the Holy Spirit important for believers today?

The Holy Spirit:

- Convicts us of **sin**. Guides us in truth. Helps us grow spiritually
- Gives power to overcome sin. Empowers us for ministry and witness

John says Jesus **baptizes with the Holy Spirit**, meaning Jesus gives believers a new life empowered by God.

3-How does Jesus' sacrifice bring freedom in daily life?

Jesus frees believers from:

- The guilt of past sins. The power of **sin**.
- Fear of judgment. Spiritual bondage

This freedom allows believers to:

- Live with peace. Walk in obedience. **Grow** spiritually
- Experience a restored relationship with God
