Use these questions and resources during your study time or with your group.

**RECAP:** Because stories shape our souls. The shows we watch aren't just entertainment—they're reflections of our longings, fears, and deepest desires. And behind every story we love is the bigger story of God's redemption.

## MAIN POINTS

- Lostness can be a gift. God is in the business of pursuing, rescuing, and rehoming the lost. Often, we will only seek out our true Source when we are led to the absolute limits of our own earthly game plans.
- God is the Home and Jesus is the Road. We often look for safety, security, and future provision in earthly things, but God is the true home our souls are looking for.
- Focus on the Guide, not the destination. Like the disciples, we often want God to just show us the overall plan so we can be content. However, the solution to being lost isn't knowing the exact destination; it is keeping our eyes firmly fixed on Jesus, our Guide.

## GETTING STARTED

- C.S. Lewis suggested that if we have desires nothing in this world can satisfy, we were made for another world. What are the typical ways you try to build a "safe home" or find satisfaction in this world (e.g., success, relationships, finances)

## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Jesus said that the Son of Man came to seek and save the lost. Why do we often feel ashamed of our "lostness," and how does Jesus's pursuit of the lost change the way we view our own failures and doubts?
- In John 14, Jesus tells his anxious disciples not to let their hearts be rattled. When you are facing uncertainty and transition, do you tend to react with fear, or are you able to trust God's provision?
- Thomas and Philip both wanted Jesus to just show them the road and the destination so they could be satisfied. Why is it so difficult for us to trust Jesus as the "Way" when He doesn't give us all the details of the plan upfront?

## APPLICATION

- Are you currently feeling "homesick" for a past season, a relationship, or a sense of purpose? Bring that longing to God this week and ask Him to be your true Home.
- When we feel lost, our greatest freedom is how we choose to react. This week, instead of demanding answers about your future destination, commit to reading the Gospel of John and simply focusing on Jesus as your Guide.
- Bring your hurts, fears, and insecurities to Jesus rather than giving up.
