Super Sunday

Use these questions and resources during your study time or with your group.

RECAP: When the church was created, it was never intended to be the audience; it was designed to be a body with each of us playing our part. Every Sunday becomes "super" not when the production is perfect, but when the people get off the sidelines and onto the field of life. Church isn't a game we watch; it's a team we join.

MAIN POINTS

- The church is a body, not an audience.
- A spectator mindset turns us into critics, not contributors.
- Course corrections are needed to get us over our excuses and back in the game.
- You forfeit the right to critique the team you refuse to join.

GETTING STARTED

- Share an example, outside of the church, of the last time you got more joy from contributing to something rather than from consuming it.

SCRIPTURE

- [1 Corinthians 12:12-17; John 17:11](#)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Where do you most relate to the 'spectator spirit' in the church and why: preferences, critiques, or disengagement?
- In 1 Corinthians 12, which part of the body metaphor hits you most: many parts, one body, needing each other, suffering/honoring together? Why?
- The 'fed fallacy' claims spiritual growth requires output, not just input. Where in your spiritual life is your input most outpacing your output right now, and where are they most in alignment with each other?

APPLICATION

- Did you fill out a draft card, and what did you mark on the card? Why did you fill out the card, or what is keeping you from filling one out?
- What is one thing in your life you might need to say 'no' to in order to move from the stands to the field?
- What is one habit you need to start right now to get yourself off the DNP (Did Not Play) list and back into the game? If you aren't on the DNP list, what is one thing you could do to help get someone else off this list and back into the game?

RESOURCES

- In an audience, your absence is an inconvenience, but in a body, your absence is an amputation.
- You don't need a new menu, you need a new metabolism: service is the metabolism of the Kingdom.
- A body that is all eyes is not a body; it's a monster. It sees everything but can change nothing.
- On the day you stand before Jesus, you don't want to hand Him a ticket stub, you want to hand Him a towel.
