Advent Reading

- Speaker 1 Join us in a reading from Isaiah. The wilderness had three roles in Scripture, all of which were God-appointed.
- Speaker 2 In the wilderness, (1) God disciplined His people, (2) God revealed Himself to His people, and (3) God lead His people to the land.
- Speaker 1 In Isaiah's age, the wilderness was fulfilling its disciplinary role. Exile was not an accident but a consequence for Israel's sin and rebellion.
- Speaker 2 But to these desert-dwellers, the prophet has an announcement:
- Worshippers "The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom like spring flowers; it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and singing."
- Speaker 1 What is the cause for rejoicing? What reason have those in the wilderness for "joy and singing"?
- Speaker 2 Because the wilderness is fulfilling its second role:
- Worshippers "They shall see the glory of the Lord, and the majesty of our God!"
- Men Be strong; fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance. Women – with the recompense of God. He will come and save you.
- Speaker 1 God will come! This is our joy! Today therefore we light the candle of Joy, symbolized by the color pink, as a reminder that our joy, the coming of the Lord, is complete in the Advent of Jesus.
- Speaker 2 Joy being experienced in the wilderness is instructive. We are reminded that delighting in Christ transcends circumstance, and that the wilderness with Jesus is more wonderful than gardens without Him.
- Speaker 1 Yet our joy is not just that Christ is born into our wilderness, but that He will lead us out.
- Speaker 2 That is the wilderness' third role: God meets us here in order to lead us to a land of salvation.
- Worshippers [Speaker 2 lights the pink candle while the congregation reads] "And a highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Way of Holiness... And the ransomed of the Lord shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain gladness and joy, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away."

Speaker 1 – This is the word of the Lord!
