Title: Led by the Spirit: Overcoming Struggles and Finding Freedom

Sermon Summary: This sermon explores the concept of being led by the Spirit and the struggle against sin and personal problems. The pastor emphasizes that true freedom comes not from the absence of problems, but from victory over them through God's power. He discusses the importance of genuinely wanting to be free, the danger of partnering with one's problems, and the reality that even those who are saved still face struggles. The sermon concludes with the idea that God's grace is sufficient, even when He doesn't remove our "thorns in the flesh."

## Key Points:
