Hebrews 1:1-3

Introduction: How Hebrews 11 Fits In The Current Context of The Whole Book

- The book as a whole is a declaration affirming the superiority of Christ, i.e., "Jesus is Greater."
- · Hebrews was addressed to a community of Jewish Christians facing cultural pressures and persecutions, leading them to consider reverting to Judaism. (Thus the 5 major warnings throughout the book.)
- · These pressures prompted them to contemplate abandoning the gospel of Jesus to relieve their difficulties.
- · However, the writer dedicates a significant portion of the letter to explain why Jesus surpassed all the traditions, rituals, systems, and laws that formed the foundation of Judaism. (prophets, angels, priestly system, Moses, etc.)
- · He explains the concept of faith and then details the rich history of faith demonstrated by God's people.
- \cdot He also provides numerous instances where their actions showcase unwavering faith in God and how such faith helped them through difficulty.
