## **By Faith Moses' Parents (Hebrews 11:23)**

**May 24, 2026**

**Read Hebrews 11:23, skim through Exodus 1-2, and discuss these questions:**

1. How were Moses' parents' choices motivated by faith rather than fear? What details from Hebrews 11:23 and Exodus 1-2 stand out to you?
2. Where might modern Christians experience fear "of the king's edict" (for example, societal and governmental pressures or threats)? How might viewing God's sovereign purposes change the way we think and act in those situations?
3. How does Acts 7:20 help us understand the phrase "they saw that the child was beautiful" (Heb. 11:23)? Who or what in your life might seem weak, small, or insignificant yet is significant to God and His purposes? How does this "beauty" change the way you treat that person or steward that responsibility this week?
4. When have you felt tempted to fear people's opinions, rejection, or authority than God's? Are you now? What might courageous, Spirit-empowered obedience look like in one specific relationship, decision, or workplace situation in your life right now?
5. Moses' parents trusted God despite uncertain outcomes by placing him in a basket on the river. How would you encourage someone to release to the Lord what they can't control (children, health, finances, culture, etc.)? Name some concrete steps you've taken in trust and obedience toward Christ in areas of your life that are outside your control. Is there an area of your life you need to entrust to Him? Explain.

**Pray for one another.** How would you like us to pray for you? Consider these:

- To fear God more than people and obey Christ with courageous faith.
- To trust God's sovereign purposes when outcomes are hidden or deeply uncertain.
- To see God's beauty in overlooked people and unnoticed faithfulness in daily life.

**Consider reading Psalm 91 together as you close in prayer.**
