Final Warning (Hebrews 12:25-27)

September 20, 2026

Sermon Summary: Far from scaring us away from Christ, biblical warnings are meant to draw us into deeper fellowship with Him. This final warning in Hebrews calls Christians not to reject God's word to them.

Read Hebrews 12:25-27 and discuss these questions (Bolded questions are kid-friendly**):**

- 1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this Bible passage or sermon, and why?**
- 2. Warnings in the Bible can sometimes make us feel uncomfortable. Why do you think that is? Pastor Mike reminded us that God gives warnings for our good and protection. Can you think of a time when a warning helped or protected you? How does that help us understand why God warns us?**
3. This final warning in Hebrews concerns not refusing the God who speaks to us (v. 25). As humans, what's our responsibility in light of this warning? How often do you think about the fact that when God speaks, we are faced with the choice to respond in faith and obedience or in rejection and disobedience? Why is it important to remember this?
4. This passage offers a past and future reason not to reject Jesus. In the past, God's judgment fell on those who rejected Him, and in the future, God's judgment will fall on those who reject Him. To modern ears, judgment can get a bad rap. What modern notions of judgment (in the law, performance at work, etc.) promote right living? How does God's warning of judgment promote human flourishing?
- 5. Pastor Mike gave the example of running to a storm shelter during an F5 tornado. At that moment, you do not ask, "How strong am I?" You ask, "Am I in a safe place?" How does remembering that you are safe IN CHRIST give you confidence when you think about God's warning of judgment?**

Pray with one another. Spend time praying for one another, our community, and our world.
