



Use this guide to help your community group engage further with this week's sermon.

Christ's Once for All Sacrifice (Hebrews 9:23-28)

December 7, 2025

Read Hebrews 9:23-28 and reflect on why Jesus is the only sufficient Savior:

1. **Jesus entered heaven, not an earthly tabernacle** (vv. 23-24)
 - a. Why is it significant that Jesus appears in heaven on our behalf?
 - b. How can this impact your prayer life?
2. **Jesus died once, not repeatedly** (vv. 25-26)
 - a. Why is the "once-for-all" nature of Christ's death essential to the gospel?
 - b. In the past few weeks, have you lived as if Christ's work needs to be supplemented by your efforts or something else? Explain.
3. **Jesus shed His own blood, not another's** (vv. 25-26)
 - a. What does it mean that Jesus is both priest and sacrifice?
 - b. How does the value of Jesus' blood compare to any other offering?
 - c. How has this truth comforted you when you've felt your sin is "too deep"? Or, how can it?
4. **Jesus didn't merely reveal sin, He forgave it** (vv. 26)
 - a. How does this connect to Isaiah 53:12 and 1 Peter 2:24?
 - b. When discussing forgiveness, is it essential to talk about more than just awareness of sin? Why or why not?
 - c. How would you respond to a friend who says, "I need to clean up my life before coming to Christ"?
5. **Jesus will return not to deal with sin, but to save** (vv. 27-28)
 - a. How does this passage shape the Christian view of eternity? Why is Jesus' return good news for believers?
 - b. What does it look like to eagerly await Christ's return? Do you do this? Why or why not?
 - c. How can you cultivate longing for His appearing in your daily life this week?
