



Use this guide to help your community group engage further with this week's sermon.

By Faith Noah (Hebrews 11:7)

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Read Hebrews 11:7 and Genesis 6:5-22 and discuss these questions.

1. **Noah believed God about a judgment he couldn't see.** Where is it hardest for you right now to take God at His Word? How does Noah's faith encourage or challenge you there?
2. **Noah responded to God with "reverent fear" while the world carried on as usual.** Where do you notice a casual attitude toward God's Word in our culture or your life? What is one concrete way you could grow in reverent fear of God this week?
3. **Noah obeyed God publicly for decades and likely faced mockery while doing it.** Where is obedience to Jesus currently costing you something? Has there been an area in your life where you knew what God says, but you delayed obedience? Are you currently?
4. **Noah's faith "condemned the world" and made God's truth visible.** Who is watching your life, and what might they be learning about God from you? How might consistent faith in God speak to others in your workplace, neighborhood, or home?
5. **Noah prepared his household for judgment and led them into God's provision.** What does it look like in your current season (single, married, parent, grandparent, roommate, friend) to help those closest to you be ready to meet God? What simple step could you take this week (for example: reading Scripture together, praying with someone, having an honest conversation about Christ)?
6. **Just as Noah was an heir of righteousness by faith, we rest in Christ's obedience.** Where are you tempted to rely on your performance instead of Jesus' finished work? How does picturing Jesus as your "ark" comfort you in your weakness and failure?

Pray for one another. How would you like us to pray for you? Consider these:

- For deeper trust in God's Word and a genuine, humble, reverent fear of the Lord.
- For courage in costly obedience and distinct lives that clearly witness to Christ.
- For grace to lead our close relationships toward Christ, our Ark, with wisdom and love.
