

Use this guide to help your community group engage further with this week's sermon.

## Partners In Grace (Philippians 4:14-23) August 25, 2024

- 1. What typically motivates people to give financially toward a cause? How important is motivation in Christian giving?
- 2. Paul mentions five reasons he rejoices at the financial partnership of the Philippians. How do these encourage you to give? How do they challenge your current motivations when giving?
  - a. Giving advances gospel ministry (Phil. 4:14-15).
  - b. Giving benefits the giver (Phil. 4:17).
  - c. Giving worships God (Phil. 4:18).
  - d. Giving guarantees provision (Phil. 4:19).
  - e. Giving glorifies God (Phil. 4:20)
- 3. In Matthew 6:19-24, Jesus mentions that our hearts worship what we treasure (v. 21). Read this passage and discuss these questions:
  - a. What's the problem with laying up treasures on earth?
  - b. What's the promise of laying up treasures in heaven?
  - c. Is it sinful to find joy in earthly treasures? Explain.
  - d. What might indicate that you are laying up earthly treasures and not heavenly ones? Consider how you might think, talk, and act.
  - e. Why is it impossible to serve God and money?
  - f. How is Jesus a better master than money? List as many reasons as you can.
- 4. Discuss how God is using His Word to transform your life right now.
  - a. If you invited someone to review your bank account this month, what would they think is important to you (be as specific as you are comfortable)?
  - b. God wants your heart, not your money. How does your spending and giving reveal where your heart is?
  - c. How does this passage make you thankful for God's grace through Christ?
  - d. In light of what we've discussed, how would you like our group to pray for you?
- 5. Consider singing "My Worth Is Not In What I Own" together (have someone look it up).
