



Use this guide to help your community group engage further with this week's sermon.

The Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20)

January 11, 2026

Read Hebrews 10:19-25, then discuss these questions.

1. **Jesus' final command was to "make disciples of all nations"** (v. 19).
 - a. Why do you think last words are so significant?
 - b. What does it mean that Jesus' last words were a command, not a suggestion?
 - c. How does knowing this command shape your view of your purpose as a Christian?
2. **"Go" is the call to live missionally where God has planted us** (v. 19).
 - a. What does "go" mean in your daily life?
 - b. Whom has God placed in your life that you can pray for and care for?
 - c. What step can you take this week to intentionally share Christ with someone?
3. **"Baptize" is the call to immerse yourself in Jesus Christ and His Body** (v. 19).
 - a. How are you currently immersing yourself in God's Word and His people?
 - b. What are ways we can help one another immerse ourselves deeper in Christ and His Body?
4. **"Teach" is the call to help others obey Jesus' commands** (v. 20).
 - a. Who has helped you understand and obey Jesus' commands?
 - b. What has been particularly encouraging about the way they've helped you?
5. **Jesus promises, "I am with you always"** (v. 20).
 - a. How does Jesus' presence give you confidence in making disciples?
 - b. What fears or excuses can keep us from obeying the Great Commission?
 - c. What is your next step in intentionally obeying the Great Commission (consider things like pray, start a conversation, encourage someone to meet and discuss the Word, etc.)?
