## The Death of Jesus, Part 2 (Hebrews 9:15-23) November 23, 2025

## Consider starting your conversation with one of these questions:

- 1. What stood out to you most from this passage or sermon?
- 2. Why do you think the author of Hebrews spends so much time explaining the necessity of Jesus' death?

## Read Hebrews 9:15-23 and reflect on why Jesus had to die<sup>1</sup>:

- 1. Covenants demand death—the example of a will (vv. 16-17)
  - a. How does the author relate the benefits of a will and death?
  - b. How does the example of a will help us understand the new covenant?
  - c. What does this example teach us about the seriousness and intention of God's promise?
- 2. Covenants demand death—pictured in the Old Testament (vv. 18-20)
  - a. What did Moses do to confirm the old covenant?
  - b. Why is blood central to covenant-making in Scripture?
  - c. What does this reveal about God's holiness and justice?
  - d. How does this challenge the tendency to treat sin lightly?
- 3. Covenants demand death—pointing to fulfillment by Jesus (vv. 21-23)
  - a. Why was purification with blood necessary?
  - b. What does the text say about the heavenly things and purification?
  - c. How important is Jesus' blood in your understanding of the gospel?
  - d. How can you proclaim the power of Jesus' blood in your conversations this week?

Pray for one another: How would you like us to pray for you in light of this discussion?
