



Use this guide to help your community group engage further with this week's sermon.

Our Perfect High Priest (Hebrews 7:23–28)

October 5, 2025

1. **Consider this question to start your conversation:** When was the last time you realized that life is fragile and impermanent?
2. **Read Hebrews 7:23–28 and observe some of the main points:**
 - a. What contrasts are made between Jesus and the Old Testament priests?
 - b. What does verse 25 say about the extent of Jesus' saving work?
 - c. What qualities of Jesus are highlighted in verse 26?
 - d. How is Jesus' sacrifice described in verse 27?
3. **Reflect on this passage and sermon:**
 - a. Why is permanence important in a high priest? Does Jesus' eternal priesthood give you confidence? Why (not)?
 - b. What does it mean that Jesus "always lives to make intercession" (v. 25)? How does this challenge or comfort your experience of the everyday Christian life?
 - c. Which of Jesus' qualities in verse 26 (holy, innocent, unstained, exalted) stands out most to you? Why? How do these qualities make Him uniquely qualified to represent us before God?
 - d. What does "once for all" mean in the context of Jesus' sacrifice? How does this truth affect your understanding of forgiveness and assurance of salvation?
4. **Apply this passage and sermon to your life:**
 - a. Do you live with the assurance that Jesus has saved you "to the uttermost"? Why (not)? How can we help one another remember Jesus' daily intercession for us?
 - b. Are your desires and behaviors from the past week consistent with the belief that Jesus is your perfect High Priest? Why (not)?
 - c. What would it look like to deepen your worship and adoration of Christ this week?
 - d. What's one way you want to respond to the Scripture and sermon this week?
5. **Consider singing "[Only A Holy God](#)," and pray for one another:** How would you like us to pray for you in light of this discussion?
