Finish in Faith: Making Disciples (Matthew 28:16-20)

February 8, 2026

Read Matthew 28:16-20 and discuss these questions:

1. What stood out to you from this passage or sermon? When have you worked really hard to finish something important to you, and what was that like?
2. What is Jesus calling His people to when He says, "make disciples of all nations"? In what ways can a new facility serve and support our church in living out this mission?
3. Why is it important to remember that God's primary project is building a people as we step into our "Finish in Faith" campaign (see also Eph. 2:19-20)?
4. Jesus frames the calling to make disciples between His ultimate authority and the promise of His presence to the end of the age. How do the authority and presence of Christ guide and strengthen us at this particular moment as we seek to live as His people? Give specific examples.
5. How might God use this "Finish in Faith" campaign to form us as disciples?
6. How can giving of our time, talents, and treasures shape our hearts and help our church make more disciples in this generation and the ones to come?

Pray for one another according to this passage: How would you like us to pray for you in light of this passage and conversation?

Also, consider praying together through the "Finish in Faith" theme, make disciples (you can access the full Prayer, Fasting, & Reflection Guide here: <https://lqc.church/prayer-and-fasting-finish-in-faith>):

- During this season, ask the Lord to use every delay, sacrifice, and decision to deepen your faith, patience, generosity, unity, thankfulness, and holiness.
- Pray that He would expose any self-centeredness, grumbling, fear, and spiritual laziness, and replace them with love, trust, and obedience.
- Ask Him to use our new facility as a place where disciples are regularly made, baptized, and taught to obey all that Christ has commanded to the end of the age.
