



Use this guide to help your community group engage further with this week's sermon.

Read Hebrews 11:24-26, skim through Exodus 1-2, and discuss these questions:

1. What stood out to you in this passage and sermon?
2. In Hebrews 11:24-26, what specifically did Moses refuse, choose, and consider? How do these verbs help you see what faith in Christ actually does in a person's life?
3. Egypt was an earthly kingdom full of promises and pleasures. Where do you see "Egypt-like palaces" in our culture today (think of places that offer security, status, or comfort apart from God)? How have you personally felt their pull?
4. Moses chose "to be mistreated with the people of God" rather than enjoy "the fleeting pleasures of sin" (v. 25). What are some modern "fleeting pleasures" that can cloud our vision of God's promises? How does this passage challenge the way we define success, wealth, and satisfaction right now?
5. When was a time in your life when a good thing or a sinful thing quietly competed with Christ for your deepest loyalty? What did it look like in practical terms to loosen your grip on that master and follow Jesus instead? How would you encourage a friend struggling with something like this?
6. If you examined your time, attention, and choices, what promises are currently guiding your life? What is one concrete step of obedience you can take this week to look to Christ and His reward to be the guiding promises of your life?

Pray for one another. How would you like us to pray for you? Consider these:

- For a clearer sight of Christ's great reward
- For the courage to endure reproach and mistreatment over sin's fleeting pleasures
- For strength to resist godless kingdoms and loosen our grip on worldly masters

Consider reading Colossians 3:1-4 together as you close in prayer.
