- 3. According to verses 20 and 25, what are Paul's priorities as he considers his life and death?
 - a. How are these priorities counter-cultural today?
- 4. How does Paul complete this sentence: For me, to live is (v. 21)?
 - a. In your weaker moments, how do you tend to complete this sentence?
 - b. Why is "Christ" the only satisfying answer to this?
 - c. What would it look like to demonstrate that Christ is your life in these areas:
 - i. Your relationships with family, friends, and neighbors?
 - ii. The way you work?
 - iii. The way you serve?
 - iv. The way you endure hardship and suffering?
 - v. The way you act when no one is around?
