



Use this guide to help your community group engage further with this week's sermon.

The Tabernacle (Hebrews 9:1–10)

October 26, 2025

1. **Consider this question to start your conversation:** How do you think most people typically respond to rules and regulations in spiritual life?
2. **Read Hebrews 9:1–10 and observe some of the main points:**
 - a. What were the main sections of the tabernacle described in this passage?
 - b. Who was allowed to enter these places, and what did they do?
 - c. What items were placed in these sections, and what did they communicate about God?
 - d. According to vv. 8-10, what limitations did the OT tabernacle and worship system have?
3. **Reflect on this passage and sermon:**
 - a. Why do you think God designed OT worship with such strict access and regulations?
 - b. How do the tabernacle and OT worship regulations reflect God's glory and grace?
 - c. What does this passage teach about the difference between conviction and cleansing of conscience? Why couldn't the OT worship system cleanse the conscience?
 - d. Can you share about a time when you felt like you had limited access to God? What did that season teach you about His holiness or your need for grace?
4. **Apply this passage and sermon to your life:**
 - a. What does it look like to worship with both awe and confidence?
 - b. When was a time you experienced deep joy or reverence in worship? What made that moment meaningful to you?
 - c. When have you felt peace in your conscience because of Jesus? What led to that breakthrough?
 - d. How does knowing that Jesus tore the veil impact your approach to God this week?
5. **Read Psalm 145 and pray for one another:** How would you like us to pray for you in light of this discussion?
