



Use this guide to help your community group engage further with this week's sermon.

By Faith Moses, Part 2 (Hebrews 11:27-29)

June 7, 2026

Read Hebrews 11:27-29 and discuss these questions:

1. What stood out to you in this passage and sermon, and why?
2. What does this passage show us about the character of God in each scene: leaving Egypt, keeping Passover, and crossing the Red Sea? How can seeing who He is reshape our understanding of living by faith?
3. Where in this passage do you most clearly see that salvation is by grace and not by moral superiority? Why is that crucial for how we think about ourselves and others who don't yet know Christ?
4. When you look closely at the Red Sea moment in verse 29, how does this story clarify the difference between the object of faith (who we trust) and the amount of faith (how strong we feel)? Why does that distinction matter for Christians who struggle with doubt?
5. How does this passage portray faith as a lifelong walk rather than a single heroic sprint in Moses' life? What practices or habits could help you and our group steadily "see Him who is invisible" (v. 27) over decades, not just during spiritual highs?
6. This week, where have you felt most pressured to live by sight (for example, through work expectations, money concerns, relationships, or cultural approval)? Why might the picture of faith in Christ in this specific passage (seeing the invisible God, trusting the blood, and walking impossible paths) speak directly into that situation right now?

Pray for one another. How would you like us to pray for you? Consider these:

- For eyes to see the invisible God and endure hardship by clinging to Christ
- To rest entirely in Jesus' protecting blood, not mixing hope with our performance
- For courage to walk forward where paths seem impossible, trusting Christ to make a way.
