Main Idea

As fully surrendered follower of Christ, God has a standard. And this standard must serve as the foundation to be a fully surrendered follower of Christ. Our good deeds must be done for the right reason.

Discussion One

Watch Out! Matthew 6:1

- Watch out! Don't do your good deeds (practicing righteousness) publicly to be seen.
- God is just as concerned with how we relate to one another as He is with out we relate to Him.
- The Kingdom should dictate what we do.
- Our challenge in our culture is that we want to make our own standard of what is true, right and good.
- God established laws in the Old Testament that DO translate to the New Testament.
- 3 Types of Laws/Systems God established for the Hebrews
 - o Ceremonial Law applied to Israel only
 - o Dietary Law established for good health
 - o Moral Law these did translate to the New Testament and applies to us.
 - God's moral law cannot be altered because of our changing cultures.
 - God has a standard of being a fully surrendered follower of Christ.
- Do we want to glorify ourselves or glorify God?
- Read: Revelation 5: 1-4 (NLT)
 - o Is there anyone worthy to open the scrolls?
 - o Jesus is the only one worthy.
- We do our good deeds because we are in love with Him (Jesus) the only one who is worthy.
- Why is the right motive important?
 - o Read Hebrews 11:6 (NLT) God wants to reward you.
 - o God loves you and He is for you.

Discussion Two

Good Deeds are expressed in GIVING.

- Giving is the truest sign of surrender.
- Read Matthew 6:2-4 (NLT)
- WHEN YOU give As a fully surrendered follower of Christ, it is expected that we will give.
- The only thing to answer is HOW, HOW MUCH, and TO WHOM am I going to give?
- In the Kingdom of God, when we give, we increase. (Read: Prov. 11:24-25, 2 Cor. 9:7)
- Giving is intentional. Time, talent and treasure.
- If you have a heart to be generous, God will get the resource to you.

Discussion Three

Good Deeds are expressed in PRAYING.

- Praying is a sign of submission.
- Read: Matthew 6:5-6 (NLT)
- WHEN you PRAY It is understood that we WILL pray.
- There are needs in our life that ONLY prayer can fill. The presence of God fills us up.
- "Medicate" our pain with the presence of God.
- Our reward is more of His presence.
 - o Brings life, joy, pleasure and our happy hormones (dopamine, serotonin, endorphins).
- Our reward is also answered prayer.

Discussion Four

Good Deeds are expressed in FASTING.

- Fasting is a sign of sacrifice.
- Read Matthew: 6:16-18
- WHEN you fast (not IF you fast)
- Fasting is a discipline in our life as a fully surrendered follower of Christ.
- Fasting is a normal part of our routine at Covenant Church.
- We want revival, we want change.
- Read Isaiah 58:6-14
- Salvation, healing, protection, guidance.
- Fasting is a sign of sacrificial living.
