## When You Pray

The Bible says that when we pray that the sick will be healed, the dead will rise, mountain will move, and more. The Bible says the effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much (James 5:16). Jesus said in John 1 that greater things will be done by those who come after Him. But what is it about prayer that gives us this power? What is it that makes prayer so powerful? The apostles might have been wondering this when they asked Jesus to teach them to pray in Matthew 6:9-15.

That <u>how</u> begins with understanding God's condition towards us. He not only wants us to speak to Him and hear His voice, but He also wants us to know <u>His immense and unending</u> love for us.

Therefore, we should be praying for the revelation found in the Love of God! This revelation is how we gain the healing, the freedom, and the deliverance Jesus taught of and the by the disciples' lives. This love is how blind eyes are opened, how deaf ears hear, how the lame walk, and the dead rise. Understanding this Divine Love will open the floodgates of heaven and allow God's blessings to be freely poured upon us!

Take a moment and just consider His great love and just allow it to overcome you. Allow yourself to be consumed and filled with His love for others and you.
