
faithfulness



Faithfulness. It's something I've been struggling with and will most likely continue to struggle with throughout my life. How do I stay faithful in Him? Specifically, how do I remain faithful in Him during the dry seasons? Spiritually, it's been at an all-time low for me. It is always humbling, as someone who likes to have things under control and is very stubborn, to be reminded of my weakness and sinfulness being human. If I don't rely on God's strength and rely on my own, the outcome seems pretty clear to what will eventually happen. It's no surprise that I've been in a drought for such a long period repetitively. It's the epitome of "The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak" (v.41).

So what was my conclusion to how do I stay faithful in Him? Realizing that only through God's strength am I able to remain faithful. To say that I have everything figured out regarding this question is far from the truth. But one thing I know and keep in mind on a regular basis is that my heart needs to be aligned toward God for me to stay faithful; otherwise, I will fall back into my sinful nature at some point again.

The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak. Let's not rely on our own strength, which tends to be full of weaknesses and sin. Let's keep God close, focus on Him, and continue to ask for the strength to do His will as a faithful servant and not our own.
