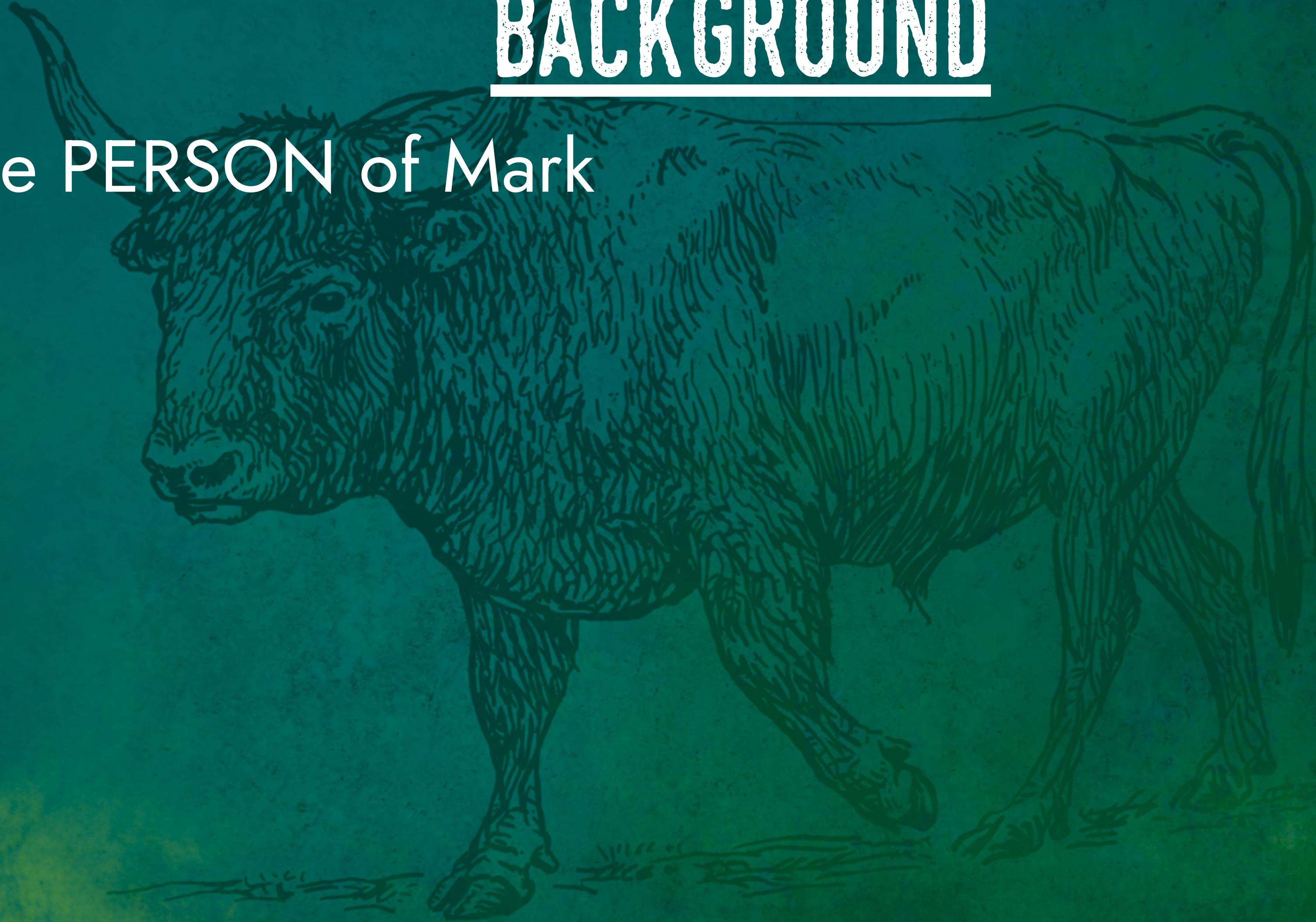

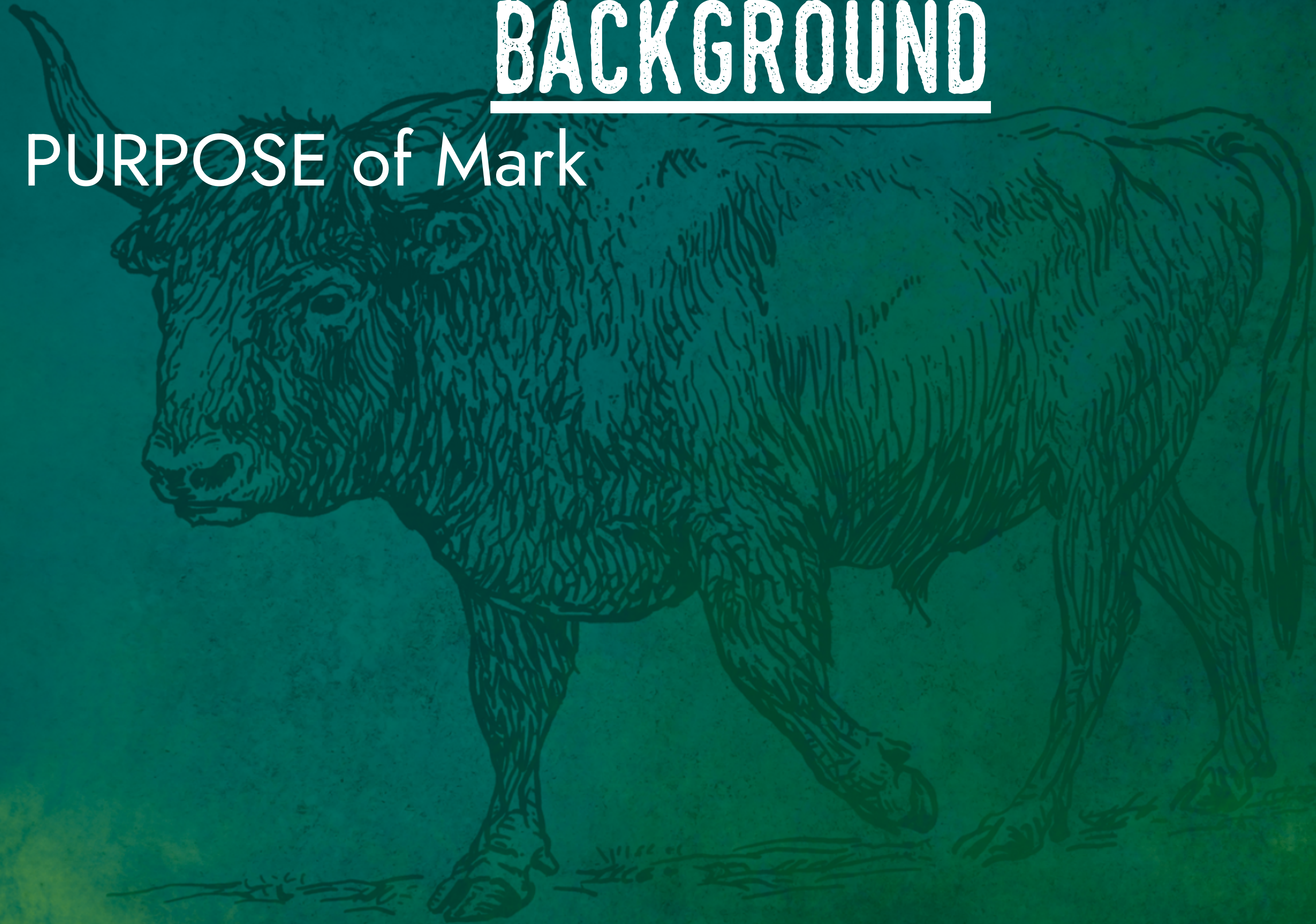

Mark: Jesus as the lowly servant (Ox)

Luke: Jesus as the Son of Man (Man)

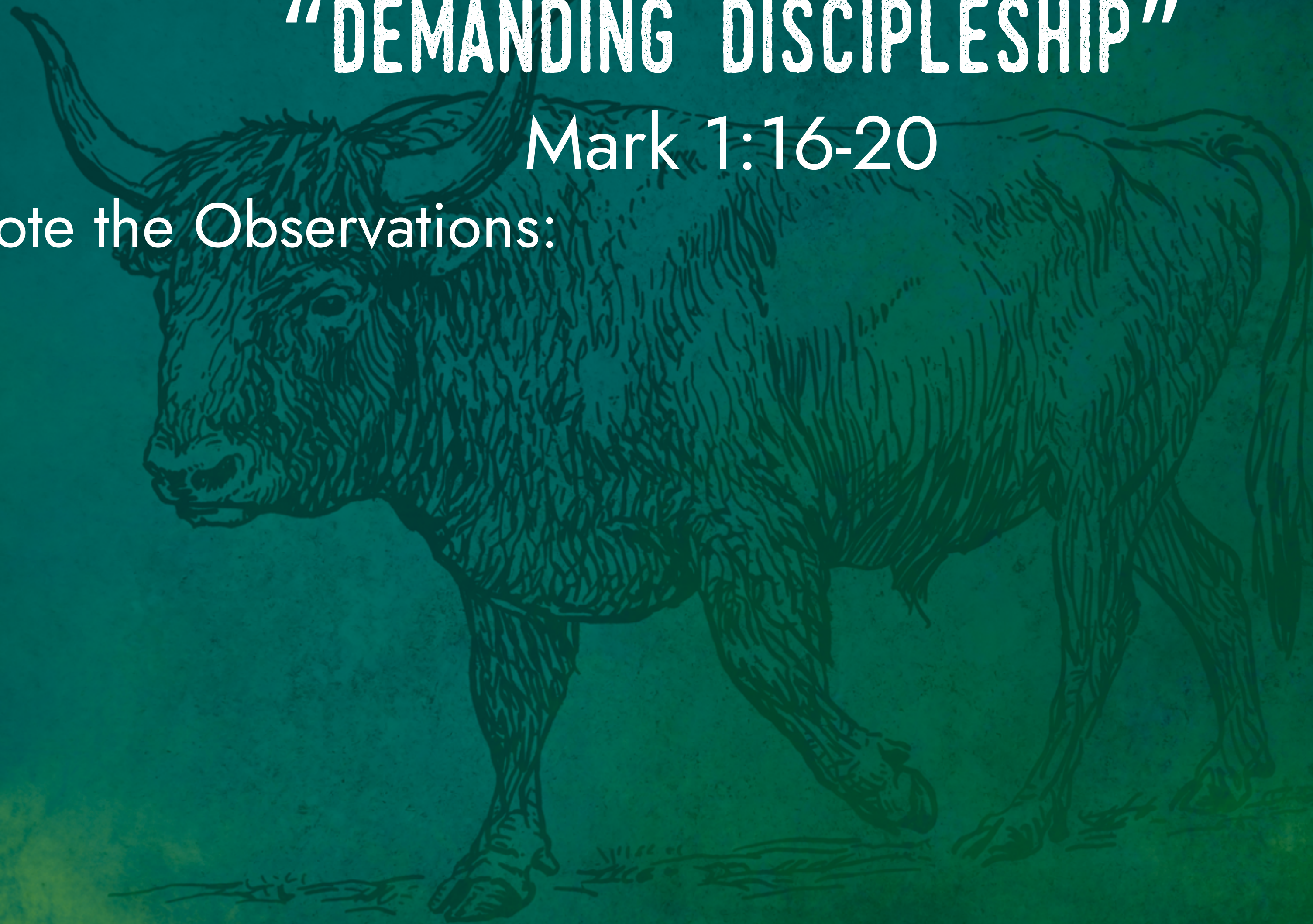
John: Jesus as the Son of God (Eagle)
