Trusting Jesus | Mark 9:14-29

Intro: Good Morning Church, Turn in your Bible to Mark 9:14-29

- We are continuing to walk our way through the book of Mark and last week we saw Jesus call his disciples to have complete devotion to him.
- This morning we are going to spend some time here in Mark 9 looking at the Jesus' call for us to trust in him

Lets Read Mark 9:14-29

- ♦ A few months ago, me and Doug went on a trip to attend a funeral. Lawson's father had passed away and me and Doug were going to attend the funeral.
- We were told it was in Blackhawk. Not being from the Delta I had no idea where this was, so I trusted Doug did and he was driving.
- ◊ So I get in the car with Doug and he takes off, and I blindly trust he knows where we are headed. Then we turn on a road that says, "Bridge Out 7 Miles Ahead".
- Me being very observant and wanting to help Doug out let him know about the sign, which he disregarded because he trusted there would be a detour.
- ♦ 7 miles later we both come to realize that there is no detour.
- So here we are: I trusted Doug, Doug trusted the detour, and we were both disappointed.
- Maybe this has happened to you? You trusted a map, or your gps, or someone's direction only to end up being lost somewhere.
- Well this morning we want to look at this question of trust as we consider Mark 9.

FCF: What Do You Trust In?

- But as we look at this question of Trust, What Do You Trust In?
- ♦ Mark 9 shows us that.....

SI: We Can Trust In Jesus.

- ♦ In our world and time there are so many places for us to rest our trust in.
- Trust in: a job, a spouse / family, finances, the government / political leader, your reputation, a religious person / pastor, technology, or a lifestyle.
- ♦ But our passage shows Jesus challenging his disciples to have faith and trust in him as well as a desperate father to have trust in Him.
- ♦ **King David** knew this truth and need to trust in God as he wrote Psalm 40:4 and Psalm 62:8
- Blessed is the man who makes the LORD his trust, who does not turn to the proud, to those who go astray after a lie!;
 Trust in him at all times, you people; pour out your hearts before him. God is our refuge.
- ♦ We know from the life of David all the ways God proved he was **trustworthy**.
- ♦ And here in Mark 9 Jesus shows us **3 ways to develop** our trust in him as well.
- \diamond First we see we need to...

1.) Remember Who He Is (v.14-19)

- ♦ This story begins with a stark contrast from the previous passage of the Transfiguration.
 - Glory to an argument.
- Disciples have **failed** to help a **father** in need.
 - \circ $\,$ Son with demonic spirit $\,$
- **Demonic spirits are not a common subject** we talk about.
 - \circ In the bible.
 - \circ A spiritual world/realm we are a part of.
- Satan seeks to steal, kill, and destroy in the life of this boy and in our lives as well.
 - One of the best ways Satan tricks us is by making us think **he doesn't exist**. Let this story remind you.
- **Oracle Rebuke and lament**
 - \circ To his disciples
 - $\circ \quad \text{Faithlessness \& How long} \\$
 - "I won't be here forever, when will you get it!"

♦ Argument with the scribes

- About their **ability** to cast out spirits
- Concerned about themselves
- Lost sight of who gave the authority.
- Leave a father still hopeless.
- They wanted to cast the demon out, they wanted the story to tell, but they also forgot under whose authority they were operating.
- They **lost sight of Jesus** and who he was and what he could do, they **trusted themselves** over their savior.
- \diamond This so often is the case with our own trust in Jesus.
- ♦ We seek to tackle every problem, circumstance, and issue with a **trust in ourselves** or something else and
- If things go **bad**, **then** we can trust in Jesus.
- ◊ Tried to rely on previous connection with Christ in the past to empower them in the present.
 - o not a 1-time event, then you move on with life.
 - Daily **remembering** who Jesus really is.
- ♦ I want you to listen as I try to remind you of who Jesus is.
- ♦ Immanuel God with us (Matthew 1:23)
- ♦ Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world (John1:29)

- ♦ The Bread of Life (John 6:35
- The Light of the World (John 8)
- $\diamond\quad \text{The Gate for the Sheep (John 10)}$
- ♦ The Good Shepherd (John 10)
- $\diamond \quad \text{The Resurrection and the Life (John 11)}$
- \diamond The Way, the Truth, and the Life (John 11)
- ♦ The True Vine (John 14)
- Our Suffering Servant (Isaiah 53)
- Our Mediator (1 Tim 2:5)
- ♦ The Living Stone who, rejected is our cornerstone (1 Peter 2)
- ♦ The Lion of the Tribe of Judah (Rev 5)
- ♦ The Root of David (Rev 5)
- ♦ The beginning and end / alpha and Omega (Rev 1:17)
- ♦ The Christ / Messiah & Savior (Luke 2, John 4, Eph 5)
- ♦ Lord (Rom. 5:1)
- ♦ Jesus / Yeshua / the Lord Saves (Matt 1:21)
- \diamond He is enough.
- \diamond He is trustworthy.
- ◊ ILL: Amber & Ballet Magnificent
- How in the world does a ballerina spin all those times and not get dizzy.
- \diamond Find a place to focus on that guides them each spin.
- When it comes to trusting in Jesus our lives can feel like it is spinning in circles.
 - **student** with classes to attend and all the decisions to make for your future.
 - young parents with little kids running around the house.
 - **retired** who feel more busy now then when they were working.
- Life can make us dizzy, but if we remember who Jesus is, he can be the place we put our focus and our trust.
- FCF: What Do You Trust In? SI: We Can Trust In Jesus
 - ♦ Remember Who He Is.

2.) Realize What He Can Do (v.20-27)

- ♦ After lament and rebuke, he asks for the boy to be **brought** to him, and they do.
- ♦ Jesus **draws out the dad** with the question of **how long** this has been happening from childhood.
- Can you image the **desperation and doubt** in the father?
 - From childhood this has been his situation.
 - Tried everything.
 - The disciples could do nothing for him.
- ◊ "If you can, please have compassion on us, help us."
 - Last Hope
- If I can? Not a question of ability, but of faith/Trust.
 - Of course, Jesus can, but do you believe, do you trust him to do it?
 - Heb 11-Now faith is the **assurance** of things hoped for, the **conviction** of things not seen.
- ♦ Father's answer, I believe, help my unbelief.
 - It is so **pure**, so **honest**, and so **desperate**.
 - I don't have much, but what I do have is resting on you. Please help!
- Little imperfect faith in Jesus is enough for Jesus to fulfill his part of the promise.
- With just his **word**, he dispels the spirit and forbids it from coming back.
- Not **dead**, but a picture of what is to come.
- Literal translation of v. 27 "Jesus raised him, and he was resurrected."
- In that moment the Father and now the son realized just what Jesus could do. His power, his compassion, and his faithfulness.
- Not a verse to use to use faith to manipulate God.
- Power is connected to promise.
- ILL: I have the privilege of teaching church history for NOBTS just 30 min north at Parchman Prison.
 - Men who realize what they have **done**, how much they have been **forgiven**, how much they **love**, and how much Jesus has **changed** them.
- I have the privilege of getting a front row seat each week realizing what Jesus can do when trust is put in him.

- This is **rock bottom**, in desperation they are calling out, **If you can, please help me**.
- ♦ Where are you **not trusting** Jesus because you **don't realize** what he can do?
- How would you **call out for help** if you could?
 - My **marriage** is falling apart, can you help me?
 - My addiction is overwhelming, can you help me?
 - I am in need of a **job**, can you help me?
 - My **spouse**, or **family** member, or **child** does not know you Jesus, can you help them?
 - I'm so busy, stress, and full of anxiety, can you help me?
 - I need to make can you help me?
- ♦ We can go to Jesus, He is the same one the Father runs to, we can too.
- We **forget** what he can **do**.
 - Change a sinner into a saint.
 - \circ $\;$ Bring us from death to life.
 - Make new what was broken
 - Bring you from darkness to light.
- Jesus shows us that it is not the **amount** of faith that matters, but the **object** of your faith.
- ♦ The father has **feeble** faith, but it **placed** in the right person.
- In Matthews account of this same story, if you have faith like a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move, and nothing will be impossible for you."
- ◊ If you have trusted Jesus for salvation, if you have trusted him with your payment for sin, you have trusted him for forgiveness and mercy. Can you not trust him in all things?

FCF: What Do We Trust In? SI: We Can Trust In Jesus

• Realize What He Can Do.

3.) Rest in His Process (v.28-29)

- **Privately**, the disciples want to know. Why couldn't we do that?
 - They had been given authority to cast out demons in chapter 6.
 - They had success beforehand.
 - \circ But now they failed.
- ♦ Why could **WE** not cast it out?
 - <u>Past experience does not create present</u> <u>dependence.</u>
 - They were trusting in previous power given to them, previous experiences with Jesus.
- Prayer is acknowledgment of your need for Jesus, an action of trust.
- They cannot do it because they were depending on self, and not God in prayer.
- How often do we have this mindset.
 - My **previous** experience with God for **present** needs.
 - I trusted Jesus when I got saved, why is my life **falling apart**.
 - Trusting in Jesus is **not a one-time thing**
 - Daily trust in Jesus.
- ♦ Trusting in Jesus is a daily habit.
 - Everyday we call out, "I believe, help my unbelief."
- \diamond This growth in trust happens through prayer.
 - This is Jesus' process he offers his disciples and to us.
- ILL: Prayer like a thermometer for our trust and dependence on God.
 - Madi at dance recital, shivering, does she have fever?
 - Prayer is the thermometer of trust in God.
- Am I **trusting** God? When was the last time I **prayed** to him?
 - Am I taking all my needs to him first and foremost?
- ♦ The disciple's disappointment showed their need for prayer.
 - Your **needs** or circumstances are **opportunities** for you to **trust** Jesus.
- The Purpose of Redemption is **relationship**.
 - Jesus wants you to be WITH HIM.
 - Fellowship with Him.
- Walking with Him in prayer is his process of growing your trust in him.

Conclusion

- ◊ As we conclude, you must answer the question for yourself.
- ♦ What Do You Trust In?
- ♦ **Unbelievers**: Never trusted in Jesus
 - \circ $\;$ Trust in your money, job, family, of yourself.
 - It will let you down
- ♦ **Believers**: Not a moment but lifetime of trust.
 - Where is Jesus building trust for him in your life?
 - Is the thermometer of prayer showing you trust in Jesus?
- **Both**: Trust in Jesus
 - You might not have Christianity all figured out, ok.
 - You might have doubts, ok.
- ♦ The strength of the faith is not the issue, but where does it rest. Does your trust rest in Jesus, as shaky as it might be.
