

# Sermon Handout: I'm Tired, But I'm Still Trusting!

## Theme Statement

When faithfulness feels exhausting, remember—your persistent trust today is cultivating the harvest God has ordained for your tomorrow. Don't let fatigue rob you of your future; your perseverance is planting seeds that heaven guarantees will flourish if you refuse to quit.

## Introduction

Have you ever been so tired that your tiredness had its own tiredness?

Paul's encouragement in Galatians 6:9 meets us where we are—fatigued from doing right but feeling wronged by results. This message is a call to trust in the middle of your tiredness and believe that your faithfulness is building a future even when your present feels barren.

## Movement 1: Your Seed Is Buried, Not Forgotten!

Galatians 6:7-8 reminds us that what we sow, we will reap. Your faithfulness may be hidden, but it's not wasted. God is developing your seed underground. Darkness is not defeat—it's development. Stay faithful in obscurity, and watch God bring it into the light.

## Movement 2: Weariness is Confirmation, Not Cancellation!

Fatigue is not a sign to stop, it's a signal that you're close. The devil fights hardest when you're closest to the promise. Don't misread your exhaustion—it means you're on the verge of something major. Keep pressing.

## Movement 3: Your Harvest Has a Divine Appointment!

Galatians 6:9 tells us there's a proper time to reap. Your harvest is not just coming—it's scheduled. Nothing can cancel it. Persistence isn't just attracting the harvest—it's locking it in. Don't miss your moment because you gave up too soon.

## **Movement 4: My Faithfulness Is Preserving My Future!**

Your present obedience is a down payment on your future breakthrough. God is using your 'now' to secure your 'next'. Faithfulness doesn't just produce results—it protects your legacy. Keep sowing—generations are depending on your grind.

You may be tired, but don't stop trusting. Jesus was tired too—tired on the cross, buried in the grave—but He got up. Your seed is doing the same. Let this Word stay with you: 'I'm tired—but I'm still trusting!'
