II. THE COVENANTS



Covenant Theology: A theological framework arising from scripture that understands God's work in history by way of covenants.

Tri-covenantal framework is composed of three primary, overarching covenants:

- The Covenant of Redemption
- The Covenant of Works
- The Covenant of Grace

The Covenant of Redemption is fulfilled when Jesus satisfies the Covenant of Works in the Covenant of Grace.

THE COVENANT OF REDEMPTION (pactum salutis)

Definition:

"The CoR is the pre-temporal, intra-trinitarian agreement among the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit to plan and execute the redemption of the elect." – Fesko¹

The **Father** elects a people to be redeemed in the **Son** The **Son** mediates the covenant by doing the work of redemption The **Spirit** applies the redemptive work of the Son by bring the elect to saving faith
