

“Calibrating the Called”

Luke 6:12-26

1. Called to Follow (12–16)

- A. (1 Co 1:27) "But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty;" NKJV
- B. (Pr 3:5–6) "⁵ Trust in the LORD with all your heart, And lean not on your own understanding; ⁶ In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths." NKJV

2. Called to Compassion (17–19)

- A. (Mt 9:36) "But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were weary and scattered, like sheep having no shepherd." NKJV
- B. (Ga 6:2) "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." NKJV

3. Called to a Kingdom Perspective (20–26)

- A. (Ro 12:2) "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." NKJV
- B. (Mk 8:36) "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul?" NKJV

Write-up

In this message from *Luke 6:12–26*, we see Jesus calling ordinary people, ministering to hurting people, and teaching His followers to see life through the values of His kingdom rather than the priorities of this world. As He calibrates the called, we discover that genuine faith changes not only what we believe, but how we think, live, and hope—learning to trust Christ, follow His leading, and view life through an eternal perspective.
