

“Trusting Jesus When You Don’t Understand”

Luke 7:18-35

1. Remember Who Jesus Is (18-23)

- A. (Is 35:5–6) ⁵ Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, And the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped. ⁶ Then the lame shall leap like a deer, And the tongue of the dumb sing. For waters shall burst forth in the wilderness, And streams in the desert." NKJV

2. Receive What Jesus Reveals (24-30)

- A. (Mal 3:1) "Behold, I send My messenger, And he will prepare the way before Me. And the Lord, whom you seek, Will suddenly come to His temple, Even the Messenger of the covenant, In whom you delight. Behold, He is coming," Says the LORD of hosts." NKJV
- B. (Jas 3:1) "My brethren, let not many of you become teachers, knowing that we shall receive a stricter judgment." NKJV

3. Respond to Jesus Honestly (31-35)

- A. (Jn 8:47) "He who is of God hears God’s words; therefore you do not hear, because you are not of God." NKJV
- B. (Pr 3:5–6) ⁵ Trust in the LORD with all your heart, And lean not on your own understanding; ⁶ In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths." NKJV

In this message from *Luke 7:18–35*, we see how Jesus meets honest questions not with condemnation, but with a clearer revelation of Himself. As John the Baptist wrestled with unmet expectations, Christ proved His faithfulness. Discover how seeing Jesus more clearly gives us confidence to **trust Him—even when we don't understand** His ways.
