1. He Arrives as Promised (1-7)

- A. [\(Mic 5:2\)](#) “But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, Though you are little among the thousands of Judah, Yet out of you shall come forth to Me The One to be Ruler in Israel, Whose goings forth are from of old, From everlasting.” [NKJV](#)

2. He Arrives in Humility (8-14)

3. He Arrives with Invitation (15-20)

- A. [\(Je 29:13\)](#) “And you will seek Me and find Me, when you search for Me with all your heart.” [NKJV](#)
- B. [\(Is 55:11\)](#) “So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, But it shall accomplish what I please, And it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it.” [NKJV](#)
