Genesis 3:1-15

Pre-Christmas Message – Sunday, December 7, 2025

1. Deceived by the Serpent (1-5)

A. (Ps 119:11) “Your word I have hidden in my heart, that I might not sin against You.” NKJV

2. Disobedient in the Garden (6-13)

A. (James 1:14–15) breaks it down like this: “Each one is tempted when he is drawn away by his own desires and enticed. Then when desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, brings forth death.” NKJV

B. (Is 59:2) “But your iniquities have separated you from your God; And your sins have hidden His face from you, So that He will not hear.” NKJV

3. Declared Victory in a Curse (14-15)

A. (Ga 4:4) “But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the law,” NKJV

B. (Col 2:15) “Having disarmed principalities and powers, He made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them in it.” NKJV

C. (Rom 16:20) “And the God of peace will crush Satan under your feet shortly.” NKJV
