

“The Lord Who Sees”

Luke 7:1-17

Sunday, June 28, 2026

1. He sees our Faith (1–10)

- A. (1 Sa 16:7) "But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at his physical stature, because I have refused him. For the LORD does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart."" NKJV
- B. (Heb 11:6) "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him." NKJV

2. He sees our Need (11–13)

- A. (Ps 34:18) "The LORD is near to those who have a broken heart, And saves such as have a contrite spirit." NKJV
- B. (Jn 16:33) "...In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."" NKJV

3. He raises the Dead (14–17)

- A. (Jn 5:21) "For as the Father raises the dead and gives life to them, even so the Son gives life to whom He will." NKJV
- B. "You don't truly know that Jesus is all you need, until Jesus is all you have." Corrie Ten Boom
- C. (Re 1:18) "I am He who lives, and was dead, and behold, I am alive forevermore. Amen. And I have the keys of Hades and of Death." NKJV

Write-up

In this message from *Luke 7:1–17*, we see how Jesus responds to both humble faith and deep human sorrow. Through the faith of a Roman centurion and the grief of a widowed mother, we discover that **the Lord who sees** is not distant from our weakness, pain, or hopelessness. He sees beyond outward appearances, moves toward broken people with compassion, and calls us to trust Him even when we do not understand everything He is doing.
