VIDEO: Flaws of Biblical Proportions

1. Prediction of Failure (26-31)

A. Point: God knows your failures before they happen

(1) He loves you anyway

(2) He calls you anyway

B. (Jn 3:16–17) ¹⁶For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. ¹⁷For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved." NKJV

2. Prayer in Gethsemane (32-42)

A. Prayer should be honest

B. Prayer should be personal

C. Prayer should be humble

(1) (Heb 4:16) "Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need." NKJV

3. Betrayal and Arrest (43-52)

A. (Ro 8:28) "And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose." NKJV

4. Denial by Peter (53-72)

A. (2 Co 7:10) "For godly sorrow produces repentance leading to salvation, not to be regretted; but the sorrow of the world produces death." NKJV

B. (1 Jn 1:9) "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." NKJV

C. Principle: Our failures are opportunities for God’s grace to shine and our hearts to be impacted in a transformational way
