

“When God Breaks the Silence”

Luke 1:5-25

1. God Reveals His Plan in our Pain (5-12)

- A. (Ps 34:18) "The LORD is near to those who have a broken heart, And saves such as have a contrite spirit." NKJV
- B. (Ga 6:9) "And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart." NKJV

2. God Responds to Prayers We've Long Retired (13-17)

- A. (Eph 3:20) "Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us," NKJV
- B. (Is 64:4) "For since the beginning of the world Men have not heard nor perceived by the ear, Nor has the eye seen any God besides You, Who acts for the one who waits for Him." NKJV

3. God Remains Faithful When Our Faith Falters (18-25)

- A. (Ps 103:14) "For He knows our frame; He remembers that we are dust." NKJV
- B. (2 Ti 2:13) "If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself." NKJV

Write-up

In this message from Luke 1:5–25, we see what it means for God to break seasons of silence through His faithfulness and grace. As we explore how He moves in ways far bigger than our prayers, we discover the hope found in *When God Breaks the Silence*—a reminder that He hears us, works in us, and keeps His promises even when our faith feels small. This passage invites us to trust Him again with renewed confidence and expectation.
