Read Nehemiah 4:14-23 and supporting scriptures

6. Response: As the battle continued – Nehemiah 4:10-12

- a. Some of the people were running out of strength.
- b. Ten times the enemy threatened them, and many of them became weary, worried, and discouraged. The enemy is relentless and ruthless--day in and day out.
- c. 2 Thessalonians 3:13, "But as for you brothers and sisters do not grow weary in doing good."
- d. 2 Timothy 1:7 "For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind." Remember...we are to be anxious for nothing!
- e. 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you. My strength is made perfect in weakness."
- 7. Nehemiah's Challenge Nehemiah 4:14-15a
 - a. "Remember the Lord great and awesome..."(14b)
 - b. Isaiah 46:9 "Remember the former things of old, For I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like Me."
 - c. God brought the enemies plans and plots "To Nothing." (15a)
- 8. The Peoples' Response Nehemiah 4:15b-23
 - a. They returned to the wall. (Back to the vision!) (15b)
 - b. They became not only *Workers*, but they also became *Warriors*. (16-19)
 - c. What they knew..."Our God will fight for us!" (20)
- 9. Internal Strife Nehemiah 5 The struggle is inside and out! (HOMEWORK)
 - a. When Satan's attacks fail from the outside, he begins to attack from the inside.
 - b. The wealthy Jews lent money to the poorer Jews and charged very high interest and when the poorer people could not repay their property was repossessed. They were operating selfishly.
 - c. Selfishness means putting yourself at the center of everything!
 - d. Nehemiah confronts and challenges the wealthy Jews, and they repent and do the right thing.
 - e. Nehemiah sets the example of giving and unselfishness.
 - f. We are most like God when we are giving!
 - g. Philippians 2:3 "...let us esteem others better than ourselves."
