OLD TESTAMENT READING

Hosea 6:1-11

Come, and let us return to the LORD; For He has torn, but He will heal us; He has stricken, but He will bind us up. ²After two days He will revive us; On the third day He will raise us up, That we may live in His sight. ³Let us know, Let us pursue the knowledge of the LORD. His going forth is established as the morning; He will come to us like the rain, Like the latter and former rain to the earth. ⁴"O Ephraim, what shall I do to you? O Judah, what shall I do to you? For your faithfulness is like a morning cloud, And like the early dew it goes away. ⁵Therefore I have hewn them by the prophets, I have slain them by the words of My mouth; And your judgments are like light that goes forth. ⁶For I desire mercy and not sacrifice, And the knowledge of God more than burnt offerings. ⁷"But like men they transgressed the covenant; There they dealt treacherously with Me. ⁸Gilead is a city of evildoers, And defiled with blood. ⁹As bands of robbers lie in wait for a man, So the company of priests murder on the way to Shechem; Surely they commit lewdness. ¹⁰I have seen a horrible thing in the house of Israel: There is the harlotry of Ephraim; Israel is defiled. ¹¹ Also, O Judah, a harvest is appointed for you, When I return the captives of My people.

GOSPEL READING

Mark 16:1-6

Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. ²Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. ³And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" 4But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away -- for it was very large. ⁵And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. 6But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. 7"But go, tell His disciples -- and Peter -- that He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you." 8So they went out quickly and fled from the tomb, for they trembled and were amazed. And they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid. 9Now when He rose early on the first day of the week, He appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom He had cast seven demons. ¹⁰She went and told those who had been with Him, as they mourned and wept. ¹¹And when they heard that He was alive and had been seen by her, they did not believe. ¹²After that, He appeared in another form to two of them as they walked and went into the country. ¹³And they went and told it to the rest, but they did not believe them either. ¹⁴Later He appeared to the eleven as they sat at the table; and He rebuked their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they did not believe those who had seen Him after He had risen. ¹⁵And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. ¹⁶"He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned.

- ¹ Moreover, brethren, I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received and in which you stand,
- ² by which also you are saved, if you hold fast that word which I preached to you -- unless you believed in vain.
- ³ For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures,
- ⁴ and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures,
- ⁵ and that He was seen by Cephas, then by the twelve.
- ⁶ After that He was seen by over five hundred brethren at once, of whom the greater part remain to the present, but some have fallen asleep.
- ⁷ After that He was seen by James, then by all the apostles.
- ⁸ Then last of all He was seen by me also, as by one born out of due time.


