WEEKLY DEVOTIONS

Theme of the Week: God Manifested in the Infancy of Jesus

During the season of Epiphany, the church rejoices that the light of Christ has dawned for all people. This light does more than illuminate; it reveals who Christ is and what kind of king He is. The infant Jesus is not only Savior, but ruler in mercy and righteousness. As these reflections unfold, we see that Christ's light draws in the nations and brings healing to the world. Epiphany teaches us to see more clearly—to recognize Christ at work beyond familiar boundaries and to trust that his reign is both gentle and strong. May this light deepen our faith and shape our lives in grateful devotion.

SUNDAY SCRIPTURE: Psalm 96 Proclaim to the Nations

Psalm 96 calls all creation to praise its Creator. Worship is not confined to one people or place, but resounds throughout the world God has made. This psalm sets the tone for Epiphany, declaring that the good news of God's reign is meant for the nations. In Christ, this call is fulfilled. The child revealed to the Magi is Lord of all, and even creation itself testifies to His glory. To praise God is both privilege and gift, for we praise the One who created and redeemed us. The Gospel frees us to join this song with joy and confidence. *Lord, grant us delight in praising you through the Gospel. Amen.*

MONDAY SCRIPTURE: Matthew 2:1–12 They Have Come to Worship

The Magi journey from afar, guided by a promise they do not fully understand. Their arrival reveals that God's salvation is not limited by ethnicity, geography, or tradition. Epiphany celebrates this widening of mercy. Herod, however, responds with fear and self-protection, revealing how power resists worship. The Magi, in contrast, kneel in humility and offer gifts. Their example calls us to examine our own hearts. Do we seek Christ for what we can gain, or do we come to worship? True worship flows from the heart, and brings joy in God's grace. *O Lord, keep our hearts focused on you alone. Amen.*

TUESDAY SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 60:1–6 The Light of Christ Shines

Isaiah proclaims a radiant vision: light breaking into deep darkness. God's glory shines upon a weary people, calling them to rise and live. This same light guides the Magi and draws them toward Christ. The Gospel continues to shine on us, awakening faith and calling us out of death into life. This light does not belong to us, but we are invited to live within it, reflecting Christ's mercy and hope. Even when shadows remain, the light of Christ is not overcome. *Lord, keep us always in your light and truth. Amen.*

WEDNESDAY SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 49:1–7 Christ Is the Light

The servant of the Lord is named and called before birth, set apart to bring light to the nations. Christians recognize this servant as Jesus Christ, whose mission reaches far beyond Israel alone. Jesus is light not only for the world, but for each believer personally. He sustains faith when it grows weary and calls us forward when the path seems unclear. Guided by his light, we walk in trust rather than fear, confident that God's purposes are unfolding even when hidden from view. *Guide us by your light, O Lord. Amen.*

THURSDAY SCRIPTURE: Matthew 3:13–17 The Revealing of Jesus

At the baptism of Jesus, heaven is opened and God's voice declares Jesus as the beloved Son. The Spirit descends, revealing the triune God at work for our salvation. Though Jesus has no need of repentance, He enters the waters in solidarity with sinners. In doing so, He sanctifies baptism itself. Through Christ, we too are claimed as beloved children, wrapped in grace we do not earn. God's pleasure rests on us, not because of our worthiness, but because we are united with Christ. *We thank you, O God, for clothing us in Christ's righteousness. Amen.*

FRIDAY SCRIPTURE: Romans 3:23–31 God of All People

Paul declares that all have sinned and fall short of God's glory, yet all are justified by grace through faith. This is the heart of the Gospel. God shows no partiality, for salvation rests entirely on Christ's faithfulness. Jew and Gentile alike are gathered into one people, not by ancestry or achievement, but by God's mercy. This good news humbles us and frees us, for our standing with God does not depend on our success, but on Christ alone. Our faith receives what grace gives—God's love forever! *We praise you for your saving grace, O Lord. Amen.*

SATURDAY SCRIPTURE: Psalm 72 The Light Is Our King

Psalm 72 offers a vision of righteous kingship fulfilled in Christ. This king rules not through oppression, but through justice, mercy, and compassion for the poor and vulnerable. In a world shaped by imperfect leaders and flawed leadership, Christ stands apart. He is a king worth trusting, one who defends the needy and brings peace without end. To live under His reign is freedom, not fear. By faith, we are gathered into this kingdom of light and life. *We thank you for bringing us under your gracious reign, O Christ. Amen.*
