

WEEKLY DEVOTIONS

Theme of the Week: God Manifested in Jesus

Jesus has come and brings joy. He turns water into wine. He seeks and saves the lost. He loves us with such a profound love that He not only saves us for ourselves, but also makes us helpful to one another. He teaches us to fear, love, and trust in God above all things, knowing that God works all things together for our good. In His presence there is fullness of joy, and He walks with us on the path of life that has no end. This week we give thanks to Jesus, who shows Himself in every way to be our Savior and our Friend.

SUNDAY SCRIPTURE: John 2:1–11 Water to Wine

We might expect that the first miracle of our Lord would be something extravagant, like raising the dead or making those who cannot walk able to do so. But instead, He turns water into wine for a wedding celebration. It may seem like a frivolous miracle to some, until we look back and see that in creation God made us to be in relationship with one another. And so now, for His first miracle after taking on flesh, He again blesses this gift partnership and brings great joy and delight to this couple and to all their guests with the best wine. Lord Jesus, bless all marriages with joy and delight, and where there is strife, bring forgiveness and peace. Amen.

MONDAY SCRIPTURE: Psalm 14 The Fool and the Godless Heart

“The fool says in their heart, ‘There is no God.’” The Scriptures teach us that the beginning of wisdom is the fear of the LORD (see Proverbs 9:10). When we know God and God’s Law, the Ten Commandments, wisdom has begun. If we do not know God, or if we deny God’s existence, the Bible identifies such thinking as foolishness. Yet the fear of God is only the beginning of wisdom; Scripture also calls us to love and trust in God above all things. This is the middle and the end of wisdom: that we look to God for all good and trust God even in difficult times. O Lord, give us the wisdom of knowing Your name, Your Word, and Your promises. Amen.

TUESDAY SCRIPTURE: Romans 12:6–16a Genuine Love

Love is what turns the diversity of the Church into harmony. If we treated God’s gracious gifts as the world often does, the Church would look like a competition for power; where love rules, the Church acts together as one body. Christians are called to outdo one another in humility, not personal achievement. Even in the face of persecution, we are called to endure together and to bless those who harm us. Such confidence flows from Christ’s all-sufficient salvation. Lord, turn me from myself and all evil, and help me to hold fast to what is good. Amen.

WEDNESDAY SCRIPTURE: Deuteronomy 18:15–19 A Prophet Like Moses

Next to Genesis 3:15, this passage is one of the most important prophecies of Christ in the books of Moses. Moses is more than a prophet; he is a deliverer. He stood before Pharaoh and called for the people to be set free. He stood at the Red Sea so the people could pass through. He stood in the presence of God on the mountain for forty days and brought down to the people the Ten Commandments and the instructions for worship. We rejoice that Jesus is our deliverer: He has brought us from darkness into the kingdom of light, baptized us, and given us His body and blood, and will at last bring us to eternal life. Lord Jesus, thank You for being my deliverer. Amen.

THURSDAY SCRIPTURE: Luke 19:1–10 Zacchaeus the Lost Has Been Found

“The Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.” Zacchaeus was lost, but the Holy Spirit called him through the Gospel and enlightened him with holy gifts, and Zacchaeus repented. The Pharisees were astonished that Jesus associated with such a sinner, but Jesus came to save sinners. The Pharisees could not see their own sin; they did not recognize their need for a Savior. But Zacchaeus—and the tax collectors—and yes, even us know our sin and know that we are lost. And so, we rejoice that Jesus came to seek and to save the lost. O Lord, thank You for seeking and saving Zacchaeus, and for seeking and saving me. Amen.

FRIDAY SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 5:21–33 A Picture of Christ and the Church

As we saw on Sunday, the Lord is deeply concerned with relationships; thus, Jesus’ first miracle is the blessing of a marriage with good wine. Here we see another reason why marriage is so precious to the Lord. Marriage is a picture of the relationship between Christ and the Church. Whenever we see spouses joined in marriage, we are reminded not only of their love for one another, but especially of the Lord’s great love for the Church, of which we are a part! Lord, thank You for making me part of the Church, and redeeming me with Your blood. Amen.

SATURDAY SCRIPTURE: Psalm 16 The Path of Life

Consider verse 11 of this psalm: “You show me the path of life; in Your presence there is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures forevermore.” This is a promise of the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. We live in the hope that the troubles and sorrows of this world will come to an end, that we will reach the end of this valley of tears, and that we will walk forever on the path of life. We will be with Jesus, behold His face, and know Him as our everlasting joy and treasure. With this hope, we press on—trusting, praying, and working—knowing that the death of Jesus has made a way for us to share in eternal life. Dear Jesus, bring us at last into the eternal joy of Your presence. Amen.
