## Farewell and Godspeed

Ecclesiastes is read in the Jewish Community during the Feast of Sukkoth. This festival celebrates God's care for the people of Israel as they wandered in the wilderness; it celebrates God's care and joy that can be found in life, even when it's fragile and unpredictable.

From Ecclesiastes 3:1 "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:..."

While we know this verse well, it is what follows that speaks to me, for the Hewitts and for King of Glory.

We desire for you all God's blessings on this new adventure.

We look forward to hearing how God's has asked you to be his heart, hands, and voice in this new role, and we pray for you both to find rejuvenation, strength, and "pleasure in all [your] toil".

Let us pray. Eternal God, you continually call your people to new tasks and set before them new opportunities. We thank you for your servants, Pastor David and Diane, and their years of ministry in your Church.
