READING

Philippians 2:1-13

**The lesson is from Paul’s letter to the Philippians,
chapter two, verses one through thirteen.**

Paul writes

If, then, there is any comfort in Christ, any consolation from love, any partnership in the Spirit, any tender affection and sympathy, ² make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. ³ Do nothing from selfish ambition or empty conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. ⁴ Let each of you look not to your own interests but to the interests of others. ⁵ Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, assuming human likeness.

And being found in appearance as a human, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross.

⁹ Therefore God exalted him even more highly and gave him the name that is above every other name, ¹⁰ so that at the name given to Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed me, not only in my presence but much more now in my absence, work on your own salvation with fear and trembling, ¹³ for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

GOSPEL

Matthew 21-23-32

**Our Gospel reading is from Matthew,
chapter twenty-one, verses twenty-three through thirty-two.**

Matthew writes:

When he entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" ²⁴ Jesus said to them, "I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. ²⁵ Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" And they argued with one another, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why, then, did you not believe him?' ²⁶ But if we say, 'Of human origin,' we are afraid of the crowd, for all regard John as a prophet." ²⁷ So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

"What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' ²⁹ He answered, 'I will not,' but later he changed his mind and went. ³⁰ The father^[e] went to the second and said the same, and he answered, 'I go, sir,' but he did not go. ³¹ Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you. ³² For John came to you in the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him, and even after you saw it you did not change your minds and believe him.

Verses About Baptism

(Read together from John 11:25, John 3:5; and Matthew 28:19)

“I am the resurrection and the life.”

“Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, that person cannot enter the Kingdom of heaven.”

“Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit and teach them to observe all that I have commanded you.”

*The Pastor Addresses those wishing to be baptized,
then turns to the congregation:
Let us together affirm the faith in which we Baptize.*

(Congregation stands and faces Baptismal Font)

Do you believe in God?

We believe in God the Father, almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ?

We believe in Jesus Christ, God’s only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day He rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

We believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy catholic church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting.

Amen.

We give You thanks, O God, for in the beginning Your Spirit moved over the waters and by Your Word You created the world, calling forth life in which You took delight. Through the waters of the flood You delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led Your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river Your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection You set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in You.

Pour out Your Holy Spirit, the power of Your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To You be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

Amen.

Zoey Ann Hetrick, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

(Baptismal Party moves to the Altar while congregation sings first two verses of "Borning Cry")

Let us pray:

We give You thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit You give Your daughters and sons new birth, cleanse them from their sin, and raise them to eternal life. Sustain Zoey with the gift of Your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of

knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in Your presence, both now and forever.

Child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

Today we receive you to be part of our Christian community. Let us welcome the newly baptized!

Praise God for the gift of new life. We welcome you into the Lord's family and promise to pray for you and show our love for you in the years to come.

Receive this lighted candle as a gift from King of Glory. We encourage you to light it every year on the anniversary of your baptism, Zoey. The candle is a symbol that Christ is the Light of the world and a reminder that we are to let the light of Christ shine brightly in and through us so that the world may see that we are indeed the Heart, Hands, and Voice of Christ.

O God, the Giver of all life, look with kindness upon Kevin and Stacey. Let them ever rejoice in the gift you have given them. Make them teachers and examples of righteousness for their daughter. Strengthen them in their own Baptism so they may share eternally with Zoey the salvation You have given them, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Let us pray. Loving God, You make light to shine in the darkness. You create new life to spring out of old. We give thanks today that You accept Zoey as Your own child.
