WEEKLY DEVOTIONS

Theme of the Week: The Lord's Call to Repentance

The great theme of the week is that the Lord, through the preaching and teaching of the Word, brings about what God purposes—namely, the righteousness that comes through faith in those who hear and trust it. We are also reminded that the disciple who perseveres in faith and abides in this Word will not be spared trouble in this life, as Paul notes in 2 Corinthians. Yet this weakness and apparent misery in the eyes of the world are counted among the mysterious mercies of God, for God's power is made perfect in weakness. When we are weak, then we are strong.

SUNDAY SCRIPTURE: Luke 8:4–15 “Let Anyone with Ears to Hear, Hear”

Jesus gives us both an invitation and a warning in a single sentence: “Let anyone with ears to hear, hear.” Many will hear the Word of God, receive it with joy, and believe for a time, but not all will hold it fast in their hearts. Life in this world is thorny, and the enemies of God's Word are many. Our sinful nature, and the world all seek to choke and steal the Word from our ears and hearts. Therefore, Jesus invites and encourages us to be frequent hearers of the Word, so that by grace the Word may be deeply rooted in us, grow stronger and stronger, and bear the fruits of faith. Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. Amen.

MONDAY SCRIPTURE: Psalm 24 “Righteousness Received”

When we read the word righteousness in Scripture, our first thought should be the righteousness of Christ—Christ's perfect obedience to the law and faithful endurance of the suffering of this life. This righteousness is given to us through faith in the promise of the forgiveness of all our sins. We hear of this gift of righteousness in Psalm 24:5: “righteousness from the God of salvation.” We must be righteous to stand before God. If righteousness depended on our works, deeds, or efforts, we would never endure. Instead, we are declared righteous by Christ and receive righteousness as a free and astonishing gift. There is no greater grace! Lord, grant me the righteousness of Christ, that I may stand before You in eternal life. Amen.

TUESDAY SCRIPTURE: 2 Corinthians 11:19–12:9 “Strength in Weakness”

We are completely dependent on God for all things, from the breath we take to the free gift of salvation that comes through Jesus Christ. Yet our flesh often imagines itself self-sufficient and even worthy of the blessings of the Lord. This is why Paul rejoices in suffering. When he is weak—when he suffers from affliction of the body or persecution—he can no longer boast in himself. Then all that remains is Christ, and Christ is enough. The God who loves you and has redeemed you may sometimes use the trials you face to tear down false gods and draw you closer. When this happens, trust God. Rest in Christ alone—for God will not fail you. Lord, help me in my trials to cling to You alone. Amen.

WEDNESDAY SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 55:10–13 “True Growth”

Without rain, crops wither and die. Seed sown in the ground cannot bring forth fruit by itself; it needs rain to nourish it so that it produces seed for the Sower and bread for the eater. So it is with the Word of God. The Word must fall upon us as we hear it and trust it, so that anything faithful and good may take place in us. The law exposes and crushes our self-right-

teousness and prepares us for the preaching of the gospel, which promises the forgiveness of sins, adoption as God's beloved children, and all the blessings of God to be received through faith. Apart from this Word, nothing good takes root in us. But thanks be to God, who rains down the Word and its promises upon us. Lord, open my ears to hear Your life-giving Word. Amen.

THURSDAY SCRIPTURE: Mark 4:26–32 “The Word Does It All”

Here we are graciously relieved of our inclination to believe that we must make God's reign advance. God guides us in the kingdom through the Word alone—planting it, sustaining it, and bringing it to harvest entirely by grace and apart from our finest efforts or deepest knowledge. What an extraordinary relief! God creates faith, nurtures faith, and brings faith to completion in Christ Jesus. We preach, teach, listen to Jesus, and trust that God is accomplishing what God desires. God does no wrong, even when the work appears small. What rest, what freedom, what true and lasting joy we have in God! O Lord God, sow Your Word and bring Your reign to fullness. Amen.

FRIDAY SCRIPTURE: 2 Timothy 3:10–4:5 “God-Breathed Scripture”

Paul's words to Timothy stand as a strong safeguard against every form of arrogance—the belief that we know for ourselves what is good, what God desires, or that new teaching can be created apart from God's revealed Word. Paul urges Timothy to remain grounded in what has been taught, to cling to the Scriptures, and to proclaim them as God's own breathed-out Word for teaching, correction, and training in the life of discipleship. There is nothing more certain in this world than God's Word. Let us, like Timothy, hold fast to the trustworthy Word and not be drawn into self-serving myths that merely satisfy our own ears. Lord, keep us steadfast in Your Word. Amen.

SATURDAY SCRIPTURE: Psalm 25 “Good and Upright Is the Lord”

Bringing sinners to repentance is God's work; it is who God is. For Christ's sake, we are justified—declared righteous—and God does not stop there. God listens to our prayers, instructs us in the way of life, guards and protects us from all enemies, and continually turns us back when we wander. This lifts our souls. God desires nothing more than to create, redeem, and sanctify in steadfast love. If God kept a record of sins, none could stand—but God does not. Our sins are not counted against us, but against God's own Son. God remembers us and sends Jesus, so that through faith in the word of forgiveness heaven is opened to us. O Lord God, I give thanks and praise to you for through Christ you have forgiven all my sins. Amen.
