### Celebrations Sunday – Lamentations 3:22-24

Beauty From Ashes – Powerful phrase...transformation we experience in Christ What it captures is ruin to restoration...rubble to redeemed – <u>Picture of flower</u> This is what God does...he makes things beautiful when the world is falling apart

If you need unshakable hope then these verses are for you...Lamentations for hope

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; <sup>23</sup> they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. <sup>24</sup> "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him."

Jeremiah – Wrote Lamentations in the after math of Jerusalem's destruction

- Everything around him city, temple, nation, and people lay in ruins
- In the middle of this book of mourning comes a declaration of unshakable hope
  Big Idea Endless Mercy Fuels Enduring Hope
- How cool is that? God's mercy is endless...you will commit a finite number of sins...

# Give you four things that are true about God from this text

God's Love Never Falters - The Steadfast love of the Lord never ceases

- God's love is Steadfast Loyal and covenantal God has promised to love his people
  - When Israel was disobedient God was still faithful in His love Still with you
- God's love is not based on your worth but on His character
  - 1 John 4 'God is love" Imagine having attribute that is perfect and cannot change
- In the midst of loss, we remember who God is
- Jeremiah doesn't focus on the ruins but on God's reliability
   Imagine that everything lies in ruins around you and still being able to say...

  When everything else falls apart, God's love holds firm. You may lose possessions, people, or plans but never His steadfast love.

<u>God's Mercy Never Runs Out</u> – His mercies never come to an end, they are new ever morning

- God's mercies are continual Like a sunrise = Constant / Faithful / Fresh
  - Yesterday's failures don't exhaust todays mercy
- God's mercy meets us in weakness Not just God sparing judgment...compassionate
  - o No matter how dark the night...the morning always comes

Start each day not in guilt or fear, but in gratitude — because God has already prepared new mercy for you today.

### God's Faithfulness Never Wavers – Great is your faithfulness

- Jeremiah shifts from describing God to declaring to God His lament becomes worship
- Faith is not ignoring pain, but choosing to trust in God's character through it.
- God is faithful to His promises What He says, He will do

Numbers 23:19 - God is not man, that he should lie, or a son of man, that he should change his mind. Has he said, and will he not do it? Or has he spoken, and will he not fulfill it?

- He kept His covenant to Israel, and He keeps His promises to us in Christ.
- God's faithfulness is our anchor in changing times The seas get choppy...anchor
- o When people, plans, and seasons shift He remains steady.

"Great is Your faithfulness." Make it personal - not just a verse to quote, but a truth to live

God Never Fails - "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him."

- When everything else is gone, God Himself is enough.
- o "Portion" means inheritance, supply, or satisfaction.
- Jeremiah says, "I've lost everything else, but I still have God and that's enough."
- Hope is not found in circumstances but in the Lord.

Psalm 73:26 — "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."

- Real hope is rooted in relationship.
  - o Not "I hope things get better," but "I hope in Him.

You may not have control over tomorrow — but if you have the Lord, you have all you need for today.

Even in the ashes of Jerusalem, Jeremiah could say,

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases... therefore I will hope in Him."
